The name has appeared as Steffens, Steffins, Stiffins, Stiffens, Stephens, Staffens, and in the Canadian 1881 census, there were many people listed with the name Stiffins.

Generation No. 2

Elisabeth² Haacke (Johann¹) was born in 1797 in Markham Township, York, Ontario. She was the first child of Johann Haacke and Hannah Adams. Elisabeth married **Dietrich (Richard) Steffins** in 1819. He was born in 1783 in Germany, the second son of Nicholas and Helena Steffins (see Figure 02). Prior to his marriage, Dietrich purchased N ½ lot 22 Con. 5, from his father. The 22 Mar 1816 purchase allotted Dietrich 100 acres for £100. His other property dealings include the sale of 50 acres of W ½ to John Perkins [Haacke] for £25 (15 Oct 1825), 25 acres to John S. Baldwin for £50 (05 Feb 1831), and 125 acres including his brother, John Nicholas', portion of the lot to John Pingle for £250 (01 Mar 1834). "Dedrick Stevens" was a witness, along with Michael Fierheller, to Henry Herkie (Haacke's) marriage to Nancy Alexander circa 1831 (1831 – 1840 Vol. 1 Home District marriages).

Dietrich and Elizabeth had nine children between 1819 and 1832, all born in Markham, York, Ontario. It is likely that Elizabeth died sometime between 1832 and 1834, as Dietrich married Catherine Daton in Brock Township, Ontario County, Ontario 17 Nov 1834 (see Figure 03). By this time, Dietrich had changed his name to Richard. The couple was married by Alexander Armstrong J.P., with Daniel Daton and James Williams as

witnesses (Home District marriage record). The record also states that “Richard Staffens” was a resident of Brock at this time and that his new wife was from Reach. Richard and Catherine resided on lot 10, Con. 1 in Brock Township according to the 1837 Toronto Directory. In 1846 and 1850 directories, William “Stiffins” (son Johann Wilhelm) is shown to have resided on this lot, while Nicholas “Stiffens” (son Nicholas) is living on lot 11, Con. 1 in Brock Township.

Richard and Catherine had at least one child, a daughter named **Elizabeth Steffins**. She was born 25 Dec 1840 in Canada. She married **Case Wiltse** 21 Jan 1856 in Ontario. He was born 09 Apr 1834 in Farmersville, Leeds, Canada. Elizabeth died circa 1908 in Illinois.

More about Case Wiltse:

Biography reproduced from page 534 of the History of Kossuth and Humboldt Counties, Iowa published in 1884:

Case Wiltse was the third settler in Ramsey township, locating here in 1871. In the spring of that year, he came to this vicinity and took up his land on section 30, township 98, range 27, and the same year had about twenty acres broke by Cunningham and Gray. In the fall of 1872, he brought his family from Black Hawk County, Iowa, into Kossuth County. Having no house built to receive them, he occupied a sod house in Wesley township, that belonged to S.P. Hartshorn, all that fall and winter, but in the spring of 1873, having built a frame house on his own land, he moved his family into it. This house, in which he yet resides, was built by his own hands, he being a carpenter by trade.

Case Wiltse, one of the first settlers of Ramsey township, is a son of James and Electa Wiltse, natives of Canada. He was born April 9, 1834, in the village of Farmersville, county of Leeds, Canada. At the age of nineteen, he learned the carpenter trade and followed it until the fall of 1860, when he came to the United States, locating in Shiawassee County, Michigan, where he worked at his trade until 1865, when he returned to Canada. In 1869 he removed to Black Hawk County, Iowa, where he followed his trade and farming. In the fall of 1872, he removed with his family to Kossuth County, Iowa, and settled on section 31, Ramsey township, where he resides at present. Stock raising and farming is his main pursuit. He owns 160 acres of land, about ninety of which is under plow, and has good improvements on the same. He was married January 21, 1856, to Elizabeth Steffens, daughter of Richard and Catharine Steffens, natives of Canada. She was born Dec. 25, 1840, in Canada. They have had nine children—Simeon J., Alborne H., Anna M., Charles C., J. Frank, Effie E. and Glenn H. Laura A. and Guy E. are dead. Mr. Wiltse was formerly a member of Buffalo Grange Lodge, No. 94, organized in 1874. In politics, he is a republican and strong abolitionist. And he is a prohibitionist in every sense of the word.

By 1861, the Richard and Catherine Steffins had moved in with Richard’s daughter, Martha Savage, who was a widow according to records from this time. Dietrich/Richard died sometime after 1873, at which time he is named RICHARD on his son Nicholas’ second marriage record.

Land exchanges involving Dietrich and other Steffins family:

- 1) 2780 Sale on March 18 1816 registered 22 Mar 1816 of the south 100 acres of con 5 lot 22 in Markham by Nicholas Steffins and Katy (seen also as Katty, Caty) Steffins (Dietrich’s parents) to John N. Stiffins (Dietrich’s brother) for £100. Oath of James Fenwick and Ezek. Benson that they were witnesses to the signing of the deed (see Figure 04 and Figure 05).

Johann¹ Haacke, Elisabeth's father, served as a private in James Fenwick's Company, 1st Regiment in 1814. James Fenwick led a battalion during the War of 1812 as did Captain John Button. Both men's companies were part of the South Division of the Regiment. web source at end of chapter Captain Button also stopped a rebellion in 1837 that was part of the Upper Canada-Lower Canada conflict. His son and grandson would later serve in Canadian militias. [A note says that Katy bans her Dower via certificate. Sworn by Wm. - 2) 2781 Sale on March 18 1816 of the north 100 acres of the same lot to Dedrick Henry Steffins for £100. Witnesses James Fenwick, John Hacke (signed Haacke), and Henry Pingle.
- 3) 2782 Henry Pingle sells land to Jacob Pingle 22 Mar 1816 and the witness was Dedrick Steffins for lot 22, Con. 7 in Markham.
- 4) 2783 Jacob Pingle to Henry Pingle for £100 22 Mar 1816 and the witness was Detrick Steffins for W ½ lot 18 Con. 5 Markham twp.
- 5) 5379 Dedrick Steffins to John Perkins W ¼ or 50 acres of lot 22 con 5 Markham for £25 19 Oct 1825.

Generation No. 3

Catherine Elisabeth³ Steffins (Elisabeth² Haacke, Johann¹) was born 08 Jun 1819 in Markham, York, Ontario (see Figure 06). She married **(1) Archibald McDonald** in Markham 08 Dec 1834 at age 15. They were married by Alexander Armstrong, J.P., and William Tipp and William Bowen were witnesses. She remarried 19 Apr 1847 to **(2) Cyrus Bunker** in Brock Township, Ontario County, Ontario. He was born circa 1812 in Vermont and died 21 Aug 1889 in Fox Lake, Dodge, Wisconsin. Reverend Israel Marsh, the Baptist Minister of Whitby, presided over the ceremony while William Steffins and Miss Jones served as witnesses. The couple had five children between circa 1845 and 1854. By 1870, they were living in Fox Lake, Dodge, Wisconsin. After Cyrus died in 1889, Catherine moved to Waupun, Dodge, Wisconsin. This was her last recorded residence before her death 01 Jun 1905 at the age of 89. Catherine died in Fox Lake, Dodge, Wisconsin, and was buried in Riverside Memorial Park, Plot 331. Cyrus was buried in the same cemetery.

Children of Catherine Steffins and Cyrus Bunker:

- i. Mary Minona⁴ Bunker, born 21 Oct 1846 in Toronto, Ontario and died 02 Apr 1927 in Chicago, Cook, Illinois.
- ii. Rachel Bunker, born Aug 1847 in Ontario. She married Robert Lyle 19 Mar, **prior to 1869**. She died sometime after 1910, most likely in Wisconsin.
- iii. Martha Malinda Bunker, born circa 1851. She married Guy Lattin.
- iv. Louisa Bunker, born circa Jan 1853 in Upper Canada and immigrated to the U.S. in 1859. She married Robert M. Davis 28 Jul 1876 in Dodge County, Wisconsin.
- v. Eben J. Bunker, born Sep 1854 in Ontario. He married Carrie Hamilton 25 Dec 1883 in Dodge County, Wisconsin. Eben died 16 Jul 1945 in Tacoma, Washington.

Nicholas Steffins (Elisabeth² Haacke, Johann¹) was born circa 1820 in Markham, York, Ontario. He spent several years living in Brock Township, Ontario County, Ontario. In 1839, he bought lot 11, Con. 1 in Brock Township. The Canadian Genealogy Index lists him living here in Jul 1846 and the 1861 Census of Canada shows him owning 150 acres of lot 10 Con. 1. At this time, Nicholas was married to **(1) Mary**, with whom he had two sons. He later married **(2) Elizabeth Eby** 27 Dec 1873 in Markham, York, Ontario. She was born circa 1825 in Ontario. After their marriage, the couple lived in Sunderland, Brock Township, Ontario, Ontario, the place Nicholas' uncle, George Haacke, lived out his last years. Nicholas died 12 Oct 1893 in Mariposa Township, Victoria, Ontario. His uncle, George Haacke, also died in Sunderland. Nicholas' death record lists his last name as Stephens.

More about Elizabeth Eby:

- She was married to McLaughlan prior to her marriage to Nicholas Steffins.
- She received a \$200 probate as Elizabeth McLaughlan from her father, Michael Eby's will 25 Sep 1877.

Children of Nicholas Steffins and Mary (Katy?):

- i. John R.⁴ Steffins, born May 1856 in Upper Canada. He married Mary Comerford 18 Aug 1888 in Cheboygan, Michigan. John died 03 Dec 1909. (Listed in the 1861 as being 5, lived in a log cabin.)

- ii. George Nicholas Steffins, born 15 May 1862 in Sunderland, Brock, Ontario. He married Minnie Annette Jackson 09 Feb 1887 in Sunderland, Brock, Ontario. George died in 1914.

Metta [Martha] Sophia Steffins (Elisabeth² Haacke, Johann¹) was born 18 Dec 1822 in Markham, York, Ontario (see Figure 07). She married **(1) Horatio Nelson Savage** 14 Jan 1837 in Reach Township, Ontario, Ontario (see Figure 08). He was born 03 Oct 1814 in Johnstown, Leeds, Ontario and died between 1861 and 1866. The couple had four children between 1846 and 1853. Martha Sophia later married **(2) Jesse Weldon** 24 Jan 1866 in Lindsay, Victoria, Ontario (see Figure 12). He was born 08 Jul 1812 in Longueuil Township, Prescott, Ontario and died 11 Aug 1891 in Eden, Mariposa, Victoria, Ontario. Neither of her parents is named on the marriage register. She was married one last time 18 Dec 1896 to **(3) John Sanderson** in Mariposa, Victoria, Ontario (see Figure 13). He was born circa 1829 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and died of pernicious anaemia 29 May 1901 in Oakwood, Mariposa, Victoria, Ontario. A Victoria County marriage record from 1895-1896 lists Martha's parents as Richard and Elizabeth Stevens. Martha is listed as Martha M Weldon, age 69, born in Markham. She died 17 Aug 1902 in Oakwood, Mariposa, Victoria, Ontario and might have been buried in Emily Cemetery in Emily Township, Victoria County, Ontario.

More about Metta [Martha] Sophia Steffins:

- The 1851 Census of Canada East, Canada West, New Brunswick, and Nova Scotia shows her living in Walpole Township, Haldimand County, Canada West, Ontario.
- The 1861 Census of Canada says she lives in Brock, Ontario, Canada West. She is listed as married, but no husband is listed in the household. This may be because Horatio was a peddler, so there is a good chance he is still alive at this time. Metta Sophia's father, Richard and his wife Catherine Steffins, Metta Sophia's four children, and two other children of unknown relation are also residing in her house.
- The 1871 – 1891 Censuses of Canada list her residing in Mariposa, Victoria South, Ontario. In 1891, Marshall Weldon, a 10 year old lodger, is living with them.

From the obituaries section of the 21 Aug 1902 *Watchman Warder*:

“At Oakwood on Sunday, August 17, Martha M. Sanderson, [relative] of the late John Sanderson, aged 79 years and 8 months.”

From the 21 Aug 1902 *Watchman Warder*:

“The sudden and unexpected death of Mrs. Sanderson about 10 o'clock Sunday morning was a surprise to the neighborhood. The old lady had been enjoying fairly good health previously and had been out about her household duties only the evening before. The funeral took place on Tuesday afternoon from the residence after which it proceeded to the Eden [Methodist church] for service cemetery. The deceased was 80 years of age and had long been a resident of this [place]. Death was caused by apoplexy.”

Children of Metta Steffins and Horatio Savage:

- i. David F.⁴ Savage, born circa 1848 in Walpole, Haldimand, Ontario and died 03 Mar 1874 in Mariposa, Victoria, Ontario (see Figure 09).
- The 1851 Census of Canada East, Canada West, New Brunswick, and Nova Scotia lists his residence in Walpole, Haldimand, Canada West.

- The 1871 Census of Canada says he lives in Mariposa, Victoria, Ontario with his mother, Martha, and step-father, Jesse Weldon. David's age in this census indicates a birth year of 1847.
- Jesse Weldon was the informant of his death.

- ii. Mary Jane Elizabeth Savage, born 25 Sep 1849 in Walpole, Haldimand, Ontario. She married Orson Weldon. Mary Jane died of pneumonia 13 Apr 1930 in Oakwood, Ontario.
- iii. George Nelson Savage, born 10 Jun 1851 in Brock, Ontario, Ontario. He married Adeline Weldon. George died 06 May 1923 in Toronto, York, Ontario.
- iv. William Savage, born 1853 in Brock, Ontario, Ontario or Haldimand County, Ontario. (See Figures 10 and 11)

Possible Child of Metta Steffins and Jesse Weldon:

- i. Elizabeth Weldon, born 1871 in Ontario.
 - The 1881 Census of Canada lists her living with Jesse Weldon and Martha in Mariposa, Victoria South, Ontario. Nothing indicates she is their daughter.
 - Interesting to note is that Martha, her daughter Mary Jane Elizabeth Savage, and her son George Nelson Savage all married Weldons. This makes them not only related by their own blood, but also through their spouses.

George Steffins (Elisabeth² Haacke, Johann¹) was born 17 Apr 1832 in Markham, York, Ontario. In 1850, his brother William granted him 150a of N ½ lot 10 Con, 1 as part of his will. George's brother, Nicholas, bought him out of this land in **1857?**

Generation No. 4

Mary Minona⁴ Bunker (Catherine³ Steffins, Elisabeth² Haacke, Johann¹) was born 21 Oct 1846 in Toronto, Ontario. She married **George S. Wood**. He was born circa 1843 in New York. Mary died 02 Apr 1927 in Chicago, Cook, Illinois.

More about Mary Minona Bunker and George S. Wood:

- In 1880 she was recorded living in Waupun, Fond du Lac, Wisconsin.

Child of Mary Bunker and George Wood:

- i. Julea G. Wood, born circa 1870 in Wisconsin.

Rachel Bunker (Catherine³ Steffins, Elisabeth² Haacke, Johann¹) was born Aug 1847 in Ontario. She married **Robert Lyle** on 19 Mar prior to the year 1869. He was born Apr 1846 and died in 1918. Robert was buried in Riverside Cemetery in Fox Lake, Wisconsin. Rachel died sometime after 1910, most likely in Wisconsin.

More about Rachel Bunker:

- The 1900 U.S. Federal Census shows that Rachel and her family immigrated to the U.S. in 1854.
- At the time of the 1870 and 1880 federal censuses, Rachel lived in Trenton, Dodge, Wisconsin.

- The 1900 and 1910 federal censuses along with the 1905 Wisconsin State Census show Rachel living in Ripon, Fond du Lac, Wisconsin.

Children of Rachel Bunker and Robert Lyle:

- i. Harriet L.⁵ Lyle, born circa 1869 in Wisconsin. She married Frank Allen McElroy 04 Mar 1890 in Dodge County, Wisconsin. He was born 21 Sep 1868 in Trenton, Wisconsin and died 28 Dec 1944 in Waupun, Wisconsin. Harriet died 09 Sep 1955 in Waupun, Wisconsin.
 - The 1870 and 1880 U.S. Federal Censuses show her living in Trenton, Dodge, Wisconsin.

 - The 1880 U.S. Federal Census shows him living in Trenton, Dodge, Wisconsin.
 - The 1900 U.S. Federal Census lists his residence in Ripon City, Fond du Lac, Wisconsin.
- v. Retta E. Lyle, born Jul 1882 in Wisconsin.
 - The 1900 U.S. Federal Census and the 1905 Wisconsin State Census show her living in Ripon City, Fond du Lac, Wisconsin.
- vi. Cyrus Bunker Lyle, born 05 Dec 1884 in Trenton, Dodge, Wisconsin. He married Emma.
 - The 1900 U.S. Federal Census lists him living in Ripon City, Fond du Lac, Wisconsin.
- vii. Edith M. Lyle, born Jan 1888 in Wisconsin. She married Guy S. Taft. Edith died in 1942 and was buried in Riverside Cemetery in Fox Lake, Dodge, Wisconsin, plot 52.
- viii. Jessie Lyle, born Feb 1889 in Wisconsin.
 - The 1880 U.S. Federal Census shows her living in Trenton, Dodge, Wisconsin.
 - The 1900 U.S. Federal Census shows her living in Ripon City, Fond du Lac, Wisconsin.
- ix. Anna E. Lyle, born Feb 1893 in Wisconsin.
 - The 1900 and 1910 U.S. Federal Censuses along with the 1905 Wisconsin State Census show her living in Ripon City, Fond du Lac, Wisconsin.

Martha Malinda Bunker (Catherine³ Steffins, Elisabeth² Haacke, Johann¹) was born circa 1851 in Upper Canada. She married **Guy Lattin**. He was born circa 1845 in Dunham, Quebec, Canada and immigrated to the U.S. in 1856. Guy died before 1920 (see Figure 14).

More about Martha Malinda Bunker:

- Mentioned in her father's obituary as "One affectionate daughter, Mrs. Malinda Luther of Kansas, was unable to be present."

More about Guy Lattin:

- Worked as a farmer according the 1880 and 1900 U.S. Federal Censuses.

More about Martha Malinda Bunker and Guy Lattin:

- The 1880 U.S. Federal Census shows them living in Wheatland, Dickinson, Kansas.
- The 1900 U.S. Federal Census shows them living in Garfield, Dickinson, Kansas. They are housing their two youngest children and a boarder, Lena Harrison.

Children of Martha Bunker and Guy Lattin:

- i. Esther Gertrude⁵ Lattin, born circa 1871 in Wisconsin. She married Thomas Wilburn May circa 1895. Esther died 03 Feb 1938.
- ii. Edward Bing Lattin, born circa 1872 in Wisconsin. He married Marian Hannah Rawlin circa 1898.
- iii. Cyrus J. Lattin, born circa Jul 1880 in Kansas.
 - Was a Reverend according to the 1906 and 1910 Abilene, Kansas City Directory.
 - Lived with his parents at r 715 s Buckeye during these years.
 - In 1920, lived in Cawker, Mitchell, Kansas with his mother and an adopted son, Foust D., born circa 1909.
- iv. Lois D. Lattin, born circa Jun 1886 in Kansas.
 - Was a student in 1906, according to that year's Abilene, Kansas City Directory.
 - Lived with her parents at r 715 s Buckeye

Louisa Bunker (Catherine³ Steffins, Elisabeth² Haacke, Johann¹) was born circa 1853 in Upper Canada and immigrated to the U.S. in 1859. She married **Robert M. Davis** 28 Jul 1876 in Dodge County, Wisconsin. He was born circa 1852 in Wales and immigrated to the U.S. in 1872.

More about Louisa Bunker:

- 1870 U.S. Federal Census shows Louisa living in Fox Lake, Dodge, Wisconsin.

John R. (W.) Steffins (Nicholas³ Steffins, Elisabeth² Haacke, Johann¹) was born May 1856 in Sunderland, Brock, Ontario. In 1871, the census shows him living with, and likely working for, the family of William and Margaret Calhoun. He moved to Cheboygan, Michigan in 1881. There he met the widowed Mary Comerford, whom he married 18 Aug 1888. She was born Jul 1856 in England and died 02 Aug 1925 in Cheboygan, Michigan. She was buried in Pine Hill Cemetery. Mary had previously been married to a Mr. Garrity with whom she had a son, Harry. Mary and John might have had a son of their own, but evidence is lacking. John changed his middle name at some point, as his middle initial changes from W to R. This can be seen in the 1900 census as well as his obituary. He worked as a schoolteacher for a short time before attending medical school in Toronto. After he had completed his coursework, John returned to Cheboygan and served as a well-loved, prominent physician of allopathic medicine for several years. He held public office for 15 years, serving as city physician, county physician, county contagious physician, and health officer. John died 03 Dec 1909 in Cheboygan, Michigan and was buried 06 Dec 1909 in Pine Hill Cemetery.

MEMORIAL SERVICES

Elks Celebrated Lodge of Sorrow Sunday – Mourn Two More Members – Hon. M.J. Purcell Gives Address Large Audience Joins with Elks in Paying Respects to Their Departed

Sunday afternoon at 2:30, a large audience gathered at the City Opera House to join Cheboygan Lodge, No. 304, E. F. O. Elks, in their annual memorial services in honor of their absent brothers. An exceptionally fine program had been prepared. It was pleasing, comforting and inspiring.

During the past year the Elks have been called upon to assist in laying away the mortal remains of two of their most honored members, Percy O. Jackson and Dr. J. W. Steffins, lives snuffed out in the twinkling of an eye as were the two candles in the ceremony Sunday afternoon.

The Military Orchestra and the Congregational church choir furnished appropriate music. C.S. Reilley, Exalted Ruler of the Lodge, conducted the opening ceremonies in a dignified and imposing manner. Rev. James F. Fryer made the opening prayer and pronounced the benediction.

The memorial address was given by Hon. Miles J. Purcell, of Saginaw, an earnest, sympathetic speaker, who quits just before one expects him to and leaves his audience regretful that he did not say more.

“The underlying sentiment that is responsible for...” said Mr. Purcell, “is indeed a noble one. It is certainly a source of consolation to the living to know that after their eyes have closed upon the activities of this life they will not be entirely forgotten by those who are left behind. We come to this Lodge of Sorrow today with our minds attuned to a sense of loving tribute and our hearts beating to the throbs of our hearts devotion. We come to pay the last sad tribute to the memory of departed brethren, whom we honored and loved during their lives. We wish only to speak of their virtues for their faults we have long ago written upon the sands of the ocean of memory where our charity obliterated them forever.”

In speaking of the record one leaves behind, Mr. Purcell dwelt at length on the types as represented in the widely diversified achievements of the great Napoleon and those of the tender, kind...forceful American Lincoln. Both lived for a purpose driven onward by the spur of ambition’s desires. Napoleon conquered to further his own personal advancement and selfish ambitions, Lincoln to benefit and uplift mankind. Napoleon’s success meant turmoil, hardships and suffering for those in his pathway, Lincoln scattered sunshine and planted the seeds of prosperity and happiness.

“In every life there is some of the Napoleon and some of the Lincoln,” continued the speaker, “be dominated by the love of Lincoln rather than the spoilation of Napoleon. Let us so live that when our time comes we will be able to trace back with an unerring...to things in our existence that we can be proud of and of which our friends may be proud, things that are worthy of our lofty principles and will be commendable to our ambition and to our lodge.”

Dr. C.B. Marks paid an impressive and earnest tribute to “Our Absent Brothers.” “The desire to perpetuate the memory of the dead has always been a prominent feature in the onward stride civilization,” said Dr. Marks as he proceeded to speak of the customs of the Romans, the Egyptians, and other nations on down to modern times and modern memorial testimonials.

“Not alone do family circles mourn, nor the order, but the city and county mourn with us in the early departure of these two absent brothers,” he continued. “In our hearts we dedicate a memorial to them more enduring than granite more beautiful than alabaster. Let us resolve anew to discharge with fidelity our obligations to the living. Let us resolve to inflict no wounds nor injury to another. Some wounds do not heal and nearly all leave a scar. Let us resolve to love high ideals and to leave behind us when we take our departure a memory fragrant with the perfume of good acts.”

The memorial exercises closed with lodge ceremonies, the Doxology and benediction.

DR. STEFFINS' DEATH

Cheboygan loses one of her most highly esteemed physicians

Hundreds of Poor and Unfortunate People Mourn the Loss of a Faithful and Devoted Physician Friend

Our city and county is again called upon to mourn the death of a prominent citizen whose loss leaves a vacancy in the ranks of our physicians that will be hard to fill. Dr. J. W. Steffins for 28 years has been identified with public matters here in the city and he leaves behind him a most enviable record.

During his early years in our midst, Dr. Steffins was a teacher in the Cheboygan public schools. He quit teaching to take up the profession of medicine and selected Toronto for his college course. He returned to Cheboygan 16 years ago to start out in the practice of his late profession.

As a public official he was always faithful and conscientious. For fifteen years he has continuously held a public office of some kind. At one time he ably filled four positions, city physician, county physician, health officer and county contagious physician. At the time of his death he was county physician and contagious physician. Many are the tales recounted of his untiring energy and patient effort in behalf of sufferers poor in purse and destitute even of life's bare necessities. No night was too stormy, no distance too great, no hour too late for him to respond to a call for help. Aside from medical assistance he cheerfully and without hope of reward relieved much material suffering as it came across his path. In spite of his charity and unselfish devotion to the poor of the county, Dr. Steffins made a good living. He owns the cement block which bears his name and residence property on State street. He and his family lived well. When he charged for his services he always collected the account.

Dr. Steffins was born 52 years ago in Sunderland, Ontario. He came to Cheboygan in 1881. In 1888 he married Mary Garrity, a young matron highly thought of in this community. To her son Harry he has been all that a kind and devoted father could be. Harry proudly bears the name of Steffins and deeply mourns his father's loss. Three months ago Dr. Steffins began suffering from anaemia under complicated conditions. His trouble grew more and more precarious. Six or eight weeks ago he went to Detroit and entered the Harper Hospital for special treatment. Little encouragement was held out. He returned home and for four weeks previous to his death was confined to his home and bed most of the time. During this time he turned no patient away that came to him for advice. Lying on his death bed he received them all and did what he could for their welfare.

Friday night at 10:30 he passed away. Monday he was laid to rest in Pine Hill cemetery, Rev. James F. Fryer assisting the Elks in their burial service. Local physicians acted as pall bearers, Drs. W.E. Chapman, C.B. Marks, C. Gerow, W.F. Reed, and Mr. Ben Cueny in place of Dr. S. A. St. Amour, who was unable to act.

Dr. Steffins leaves to mourn his loss not only his devoted wife, step-son, and brother George of Oxbow, Northwest Canada, but countless dependent people who looked to him for comfort and assistance much as a child does to its parents.

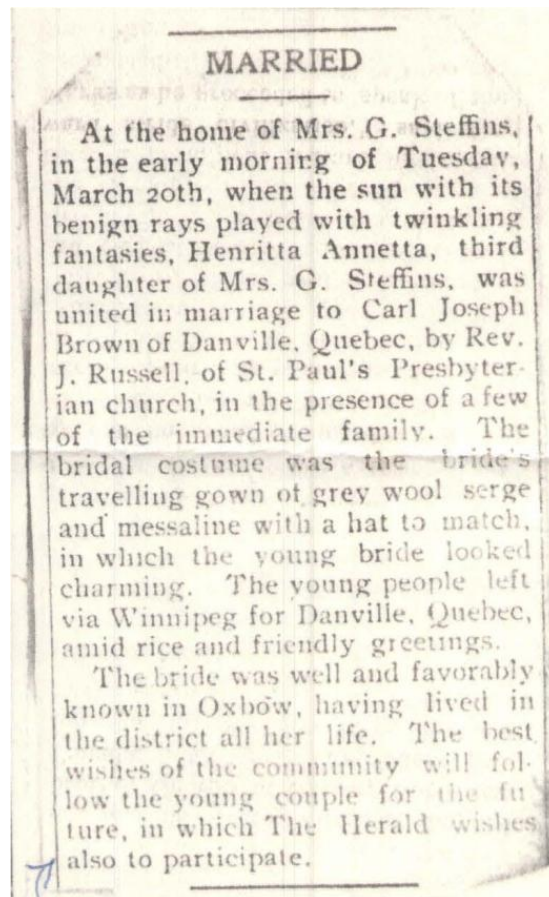

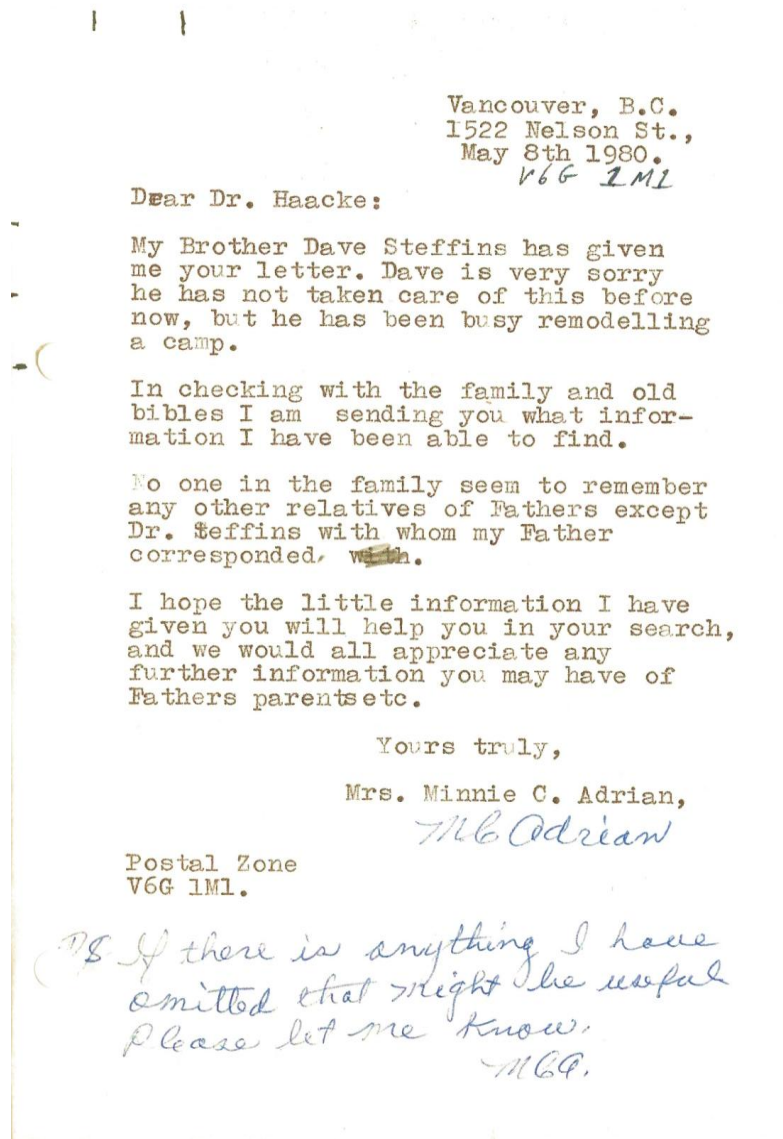

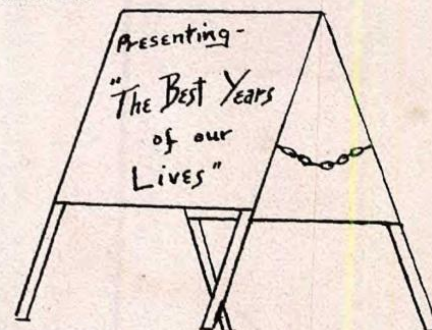
