There is a very interesting story about this. I was carefully checking the marriage records on microfilm for the mid 1800s hoping to find Henry's marriage and knowing he had been in Bayfield. This was a tedious procedure and I was scooting through the records and one entry caught my eye for a Henry. I checked all Henry entries although it's easy to miss something when looking through microfilms for hours. Well this one read Henry Parkins in the Episcopal Church records. Age 49, wedding date 7 Aug, 1859. Parents John and Hannah Harkie. My my my whoever recorded this couldn't keep the surnames even the same. However, lo and behold there it was, even if in cryptic notation.

Generation No. 2

Henry² Haacke (Johann¹) was born 15 May 1810 in Markham, York, Ontario, and died in 1869. He was the twin brother of George Haacke, and the two were baptized at St. James Anglican Church 12 Feb 1811. Henry married **(1) Nancy (Ann) Alexander** 28 Jul 1831 in Markham, York, Ontario. She was born in 1819, and died in 1890. They moved out to Goderich, Huron, Ontario about 1834, probably following the opening of new lands associated with the Canada Company. Henry was listed in the military in 1837 as a member of the temporary militia called up to protect people (or perhaps better the state) against a possible spreading of the MacKenzie Rebellion from Toronto. During this same year, he bought lot 478 in Goderich. In 1848, Henry and Nancy were

living on lot 9, range E in Bayfield, Ontario. Henry reportedly built the River Hotel in Bayfield, which utilized the same design to support the building that George Haacke used in the construction of his home. The design consisted of a large shaft of great height which spanned several feet across. This is from the 1878 Huron County Atlas under the Village of Bayfield. In 1837, only 15 able bodied men could be found and of these were D. H. Ritchie, John Morgan and Henry Haacke. These men were in the company of Capt. Lisgars of Goderich and during the winter of 1837-1838 were stationed at the corners where Clinton now stands. Dr. Dunlop was Colonel of the regiment. In 1864, Henry was one of the tavern owners granted a license after signed petitions were presented to the Council. Bayfield became an important trade and commerce center

The River Hotel had a splendid situation on Bayfield Terrace where, in the 1800's and early 1900's, one could see not only the river but also the harbour and lake. That was before the trees hid the magnificent view.

The original part of the structure was either the second or third building in Bayfield, Riley's boarding-house and the Canada Co. office being built on the lake bank.

It was the Canada Co. Store in 1834, made of logs and being one storey. Henry Hoacke built an addition to make it a hotel, and later two more additions were put on until it had 23 rooms.

The old brick bake oven was under the log part, which was torn down by Mr. Jacobs after he bought the building.

The hotel became a "stage coach hotel". An item in the Bayfield News of the Clinton paper told of Mr. T. J. Moorhouse having dined there in 1856 on his way from London to Goderich, by stage coach.

A root cellar (and milk cellar) stood near the back door and the stone walls set well down into the ground made it cool on the hottest days.

The barn was about 90 feet long with a hayloft across the top and below, 12 stalls plus open space for rigs or conveyances.

Interesting posters decorated its walls, one being for the Greyhound Moonlight Excursion

at Goderich and the excursions to Detroit. Many Bayfield and area people will remember them.

Newspaper items about these old hotels are most interesting.

1882 - There will be sold at Sheriff's sale in Bayfield at Morgan's Hotel on Tuesday, May 3, a quantity of dry goods, groceries, boots and shoes, and crockery valued at \$520 as per inventory. Stock list may be seen at Sheriff's office.

1886 - Mr. Swartz, our new hotelkeeper is adding 60 feet to his hotel making great improvements and getting ready for the crowds of summer visitors who will find Jack the right man in the right place. (A later item said he was preparing for thousands.)

1889 - Mr. John Swartz is extending his stable as he is expecting more people in the village this summer. (He made it about twice as large.)

Mr. Swartz also had a little park for his guests which, in the summer, was gay with Japanese lanterns and beside it, a number of rowboats.

In 1891 he purchased a canopied rig for the conveyance of visitors from the station.

It was owned by Jas. Pollock in 1893 and then sold to Mr. Ed Swartz. Later owners were Mr. Stephens and Mr. Greenslade.

This hotel became a private home in 1908 and the section remaining after 1952 has been made into apartments.

The marriage record I found by happenstance looking through the Home District files 1831-1840 volume 1 and noticing on page 2 a Henry Herkie m Nancy Alexander. The witnesses were Dedrick Stevens and Michael Fierheller. So indeed, I knew it was our Henry Haacke. M 28 July, 1831, he was 21 years old.

Henry married **(2) Maria Tippit Rouse** 07 Aug 1859. She was born 25 Jan 1823, and died 08 Jan 1912 (binder notes) in St. Clair County, Michigan (see Figure 03). Maria was buried with her daughter Mary Anne Tippet Meyer in Marine City, Michigan. The Directory of the Province of Ontario from 1857 included an entry about Henry Haacke. He was listed as living in London, Middlesex County, Ontario and working as a music teacher. More about Henry Haacke:

- Henry was involved in land negotiations on lot 22, Con. 7 in Markham, where his father, Johann, and other family members lived: 11298 Nov. 6, 1834 between Henry Haacke Yeomen of the first part and Thomas Robson, Merchant, of Toronto... to his heirs...subject to a certain condition thereunder written that the said indenture should be void on payment of a certain sum of money at the times and in the manner therein mentioned... w. Joseph Ridout and George Cooper George Haacke signed his name in German reg. Dec. 2, 1834 at 1:00.
- Henry purchased lot 10, range E in Stanley Township from Baron de Tuylle 30 Oct 1841. David I. Smith and Daniel Gordon served as witnesses. In 1842 this was listed as being 18 acres.
- According to *The Settlement of Huron County*, Henry served as a member of the first Stanley Township Council, elected in 1850. This council included D. H. Ritchie.

Henry's life can be followed up to 1869 when he no longer appears in the directories or land records. Evidently, he dies about this time as there is a battle for the rights to the shares of land that belonged to his daughter Martha, as she had predeceased him. A curious entry appears in the Directory of the Province of Ontario (published 1987) 1857 by Thomas and Emily Wilson for a Henry Haacke, a music teacher in London, Middlesex. I guess this is our Henry. Another Henry Haacke lived at this time in Ohio. He was a very talented fellow, having degrees in law and medicine and being an editor of the German newspaper there. He spoke many languages as well. I thought this might have been the same multi-talented man appearing in Toronto for but one year. In 1987, I found him listed in an Ontario register of names as a music teacher again, but this time in London, Ontario. It was clear to me now, considering that a descendant of his had much of his musical paraphernalia, (perhaps including a Stradivarius or a copy from the mid 1800's) that this was our Henry.

Henry had some properties mortgaged to other people.

23 Dec 1857 - Lot 15 36 perches to John Morgan L240.

30 Dec 1861 Lots 51,52 for L150 to John Morgan.

1 June 1861 Lots 16,51,52 to Paul Cleave for \$1200.

1 June 1861 Lot 15 to William Jewett \$947 and 7 June 1861 Lot 15 to Ebenezer Fisher.

The Index to the History of the Township of Stanley 1836-1896, page 31, lists Henry as having lots 16, 18, 29, 50, 295 and 495 in concession P108. It also states that the first settlers on the Goshen Line, Con. X and XI were in 1839 while Henry Haacke arrived in 1843. In 1868 he was listed as a butcher (his name was spelled Haackie) age 58 with lots in Bayfield of 6.59, ½ acre; 188, 1.4 acre; and Range E 10, 18 ¼ acres. Total value \$258. He had 3 cattle, 3 people living on the property, 1 dog and he was in the militia reserve.

Generation No. 3

Arthur³ Haacke (Henry², Johann¹) was born in 26 June 1830 in York County, Ontario and died 10 Oct 1922. He is buried in Strathclair Cemetery. These exact dates come from records of Connie and Allan McMillan from Victoria, British Columbia. He married **Jane Wilson born Jane Barker** before 1850. The couple lived in Bayfield, Ontario until circa 1880, when they moved to Elphinstone, Manitoba, Canada (see Figures 04 and 05).

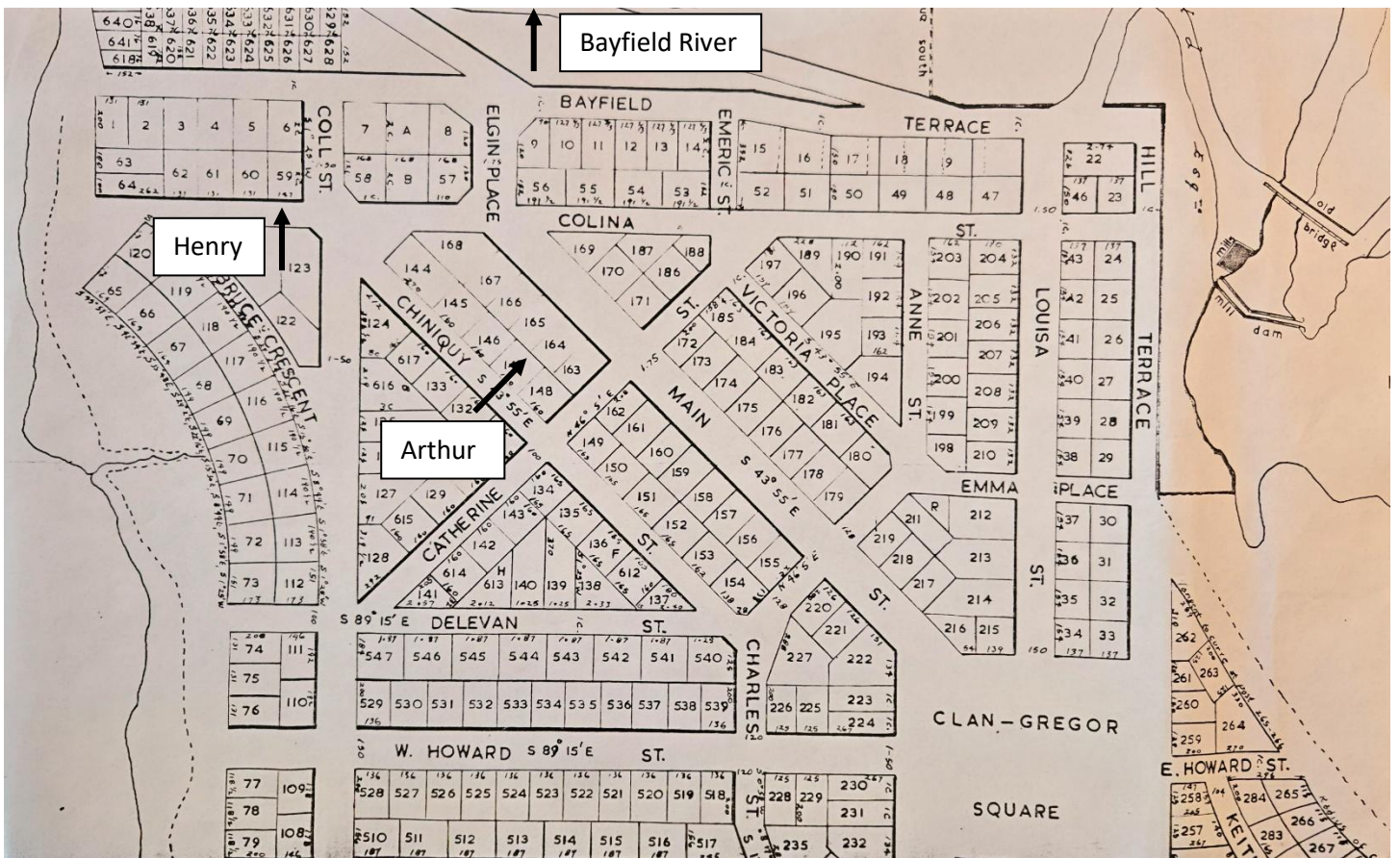

An article that is likely related to Arthur, written by A. B. Brownson of Bayfield, to the Goderich paper, Sept. 1971. "As Bayfield has gone through no little excitement, allow me to make a report on it. The fire broke out fearfully to the south of Bayfield threatening to burn everything before it. I among others went to the assistance of those emptying a barn belong to Mr. A. Haacke and in coming through the fire, I slipped from the wagon with a part of the load on top of me, but knowing my danger, I was not long in crawling out. The hay was in flames but I started the team in haste and saved all except what slipped off; and the barn was finally emptied by good Samaritans. It has since been burned. The next day all Bayfield turned out to check the fire - and saved the village." Mrs. Ethel Poth sent me this note. She was a relative William Elliot I believe who also helped with getting some Haacke information from Bayfield.

William Elliott wrote on 17 Oct 1979: A Miss Haacke was an organist in Bayfield in 1874 and played at Holy Trinity Church for the Middleton Wedding. Also, 31 Jan 1877, there was news item in the Huron Signal describing a surprise party and presentation when members of the Scotch Church "made their appearance at the residence of Mr. Haacke and made Miss Haacke the recipient of a handsome and well filled purse on behalf of the congregation who wished to express their appreciation for her services as choirster." I imagine this is one of Arthur's daughters.

In 1868, Arthur had a lot of different small parcels of land but many were worth only \$10, so total value was about \$195. Many of the properties were ½ acre. All were in Bayfield. They included lot 165 with the highest value of \$120 which I assume was where he had a house. Other lots were 166, 334, 149, 2, 3, 62, 490, 489, and many others.

In the early 1880's three different families left their Ontario homes and came west to make new homes. They landed in the Strathclair district, thought well of what they saw and decided to take root. The land south of the little Saskatchewan river had all been taken as homesteads, so they crossed the river and settled. These families were the J.B. Wilson's who settled on the S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of 22-17-21: the Haacke family who located on N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ of 22-17-21 and James Forsythe with his ten children, also their oldest daughter and husband Pat McNulty. James Forsythe, his two sons and his son-in-law each homesteaded a quarter section of 28-17-21. Mr Forsythe on the S.E. his son Alex on the N.E. Jim on the N.W. and Pat McNulty on S.W. The J.B. Wilson family consisted of nine children. Mr Haacke had brought four of his sons, the younger members of his family. These girls and boys of the four families grew up together almost as one family.

The only road to the settlement south of the river was by the Wilson hills known by that since Mr Wilson's farm came right to the head of the hills so they did not travel far afield.

About this time an old country man Mr. McDowell came into this settlement and took up a homestead on the farm now owned by Vernon McIntyre. In fun he named the different districts and people. His own place he called Paradise. South of the river was Canaan and this little settlement north of the river he called Egypt, of course they had to have a king, there was King David of Canaan, and Egypt had two kings Pharaoh and King Solomon.

Very few of these settlers are alive today and none reside in Egypt any more. Many of their descendants are scattered throughout Canada and still lovingly think of the early homes of their Grandparents.

It wasn't many years before other settlers flocked to the district of Egypt's boundaries and the boundaries spread to Wolf Lake on the east and the Reserve on the north, while the south and west were bounded by the river. A Presbyterian Church was built in 1897 also a school but these have been moved to Elphinstone. One landmark of these early pioneers remains. The beautiful spruce trees on the farm of Haacke, planted when tiny saplings by the late Mrs Haacke in the early years she was on the homestead. Also the stone house built by Mr Haacke. Modern roads lead to this settlement today and beautiful homes have sprung up. A vast contrast to the days of these pioneers but we wonder are we today any happier than they.

ARTHUR HAACKE

The Arthur Haacke family moved from Ontario to the little Egypt district in 1883. There were six children in the family, but the two girls, Margot and Nina, married and settled in Ontario before the family moved out west. The four sons, Wilfred, Stanley, Hood and Arthur lived on the farm with their parents.

Wilfred married Maude Elliott from Hamiota. They resided in Shoal Lake where Wilfred was Sun Life Insurance salesman and received a gold watch for his many years with the company. They retired to the coast and he lived to the age of 87, his wife died four years previous.

Hood and Stanley died at fairly early ages, both in tragic accidents. Hood had married Sarah Reid of the Totonka district (near Cardale) and they had one daughter Margo Dorothea. She was a teacher and married John James Munro Burnell of Strathclair. They have one son James Edward (Ted) who lives in Brandon and an adopted daughter Sarah Elizabeth (Beth) who lives in Redvers Saskatchewan.

Arthur, the youngest married Myrtle Moon, a teacher, in 1916. They lived on the Haacke homestead and looked after the Haacke seniors until they passed away, both in their 90's

I did fill in the complete names of Hoods wife, daughter and grand children. When spring comes I will attempt to get dates of births, marriages etc for you.

One item that was in this history I had forgotten was that Arthur Jr had a wooden leg. I will attempt to get a picture of the stone house and surrounding trees; as it is some years since I have been there, hopefully things will still be in tact. I can remember Grandma Haacke standing beside the spruce.

As you will read in the article on Pioneers of Egypt there is no mention of a George Haacke, and it was Wilfred's name that I had forgotten.

Now I would like to know where you fit into these Haackes, your family, profession etc.

Altho I am no relation to the Haackes, I do have an interest having been given a home by Sarah (Haacke) Short from the age of six till my marriage. Ted Burnell (Margo's son) has five children all married; and Beth has six of a family ~~all~~^{three} married (her married name is Mrs Kris Jorgensen.)

If my memory serves me correctly Hood Haacke died of a ruptured appendix not an accident as stated above.

Obituary of David Haacke

From a letter from Hattie Rasmussen. David Haacke was born November 1st, 1844 at Bayfield, Ontario Canada. In the year of 1871 he came to Montana where he worked in the smelters at Granite, Montana, now a ghost town. The lead in the mines may have damaged his health. He also lost his sight. He came to the Bitterroot Valley in the fall of 1871. He was 27 years old. He worked for a time for Louis Clairmont at the old grist mill ranch helping complete the mill and sacking the first sack of flower ground. He also drove wagon train, hauling freight of flour from the Bitterroot Valley to the mining town of Granite. The price of flour delivered to Granite was \$1.00/ lb. He was in the small fruit business and hauled his produce into Missoula by team before there were any railroads. We used to make apple boxes for him.

He enlisted in 1877 in Capt. Martins Co., Montana Volunteers. There was a filing perhaps for some pension perhaps 9 June, 1917 for Indian service 13827. Later, he settled on a ranch up the Burt Fork Canyon. In July of 1875 at the age of 31 he married Harriett Louisa Phelps. She was born in Beardtown, Illinois, February 4, 1860. She was the daughter of Major James Phelps. Her family moved to Montana and settled in Bitterroot. She was 14 years old when they left Illinois. She was among the group of local people who assembled at the Fort Owens at the time of the Nez Pierce Indian excitement. She was 15 years old when she married David Haacke. They lived in Burnt Fork area.

Another time Grandpa heard about some Nez Pierce Indians coming and they were enemies of the Flatheads and he got on his horse and road to Fort Owen. Later grandma packed up her too little ones and went there too. But it turned out the Nez Pierce passed through and there was no trouble.

There were 8 children born to them, Annie, Elva, Henry, Alfred, Roy, David, Maggie and Edward. Alfred, born January 23, 1880 died October 1, 1880. He lived 8 months. Roy (Leroy) Haacke was born October 2, 1888, he lived to be 10 years old. He was a crippled child. He died in the year of 17 Sept 1898. The remaining all grew up, married and had families.

David Haacke died on June 19, 1922 at his home on the Burnt Fork he lived 77 years, 7 months and 18 days. He became blind roughly 30 years earlier. He was survived by his wife Harriet, and 6 children, he had 18 grandchildren and an aged brother in Manitoba, Canada and a half-brother in Mosier, Oregon. When he was a young man he was united with the Christian Church. The funeral was held at the home on Burnt Fork on June the 21st at 2:30pm with Rev. J.B. Parnall. He was buried in Maplewood cemetery at Stevensville, Montana.

I remember grandpa being of slight build and a very gentle person. Grandma and grandpa were honest wonderful people and well thought of by everyone.

Grandmother Harriett milked her own cows and tended the chickens and sold cream, and eggs to the creamery. She used to let me handle the cream separator and watch the cream come out. She had an old Edison cylinder record machine. She had a top put on her buggy to keep the sun out. We used to sing lots of songs together. One was "Little Boy in Blue." She didn't like going by Harriett so she used the name

Hattie, just like Hattie Rasmussen.

Ruby Schmidling from Portland wrote me 28 March 1976. David came to Butte first and worked in the silver mines. Later he settled up in Burnt Fork Canyon. He married Harriett Phelps who had come when she was young with three brothers, William, James and John, in a covered wagon. Their mother had died and her father had remarried. She had seen Abraham Lincoln in his coffin when she was 5 years old. Her father was a judge and road the territory hearing cases. David knew horticulture and set out fruit trees and could graft them. He has a wonderful orchard and had honey bees. He could still work with them when he was blind. When there was trouble with the Indians the ladies went to Fort Stevens (which has been reconstructed for historical purposes). That would have been in May 1876. Then a group of Indians went up the Bitterroot through Gibbons Pass and on to Big Hole where they battled Custer. Later, the Flathead Indian Reservation was established. My grandmother said when they looked through the peepholes in the fort they could see the Indians whooping and riding around the fort on their horses. My grandfather David was a good friend of many of the Indians and one named Jim often came back to visit him and brought him fish after they had been sent to the reservation. After grandpa died he came by to say he wouldn't be stopping by anymore. But he did come by again for a "Union Leader Tobacco Pail" that grandpa had saved and used to give us as children when school started.

George H. Haacke (Henry², Johann¹) was born 08 Jun 1861 in Bayfield, Ontario and died 15 Sep 1941 due to apoplexy in Vancouver, Clark, Washington. He married **Myrtle Amy Stowell**, daughter of Salu Stowell and Hannah Lodicia Burgess, Nov 1889 in Bottineau, Bottineau, North Dakota (divorce document). Presbyterian

minister D. McMillan presided over the ceremony. Myrtle was born 03 Jul 1873 in Otter Creek, Eau Claire, Wisconsin and died 01 Sep 1946 in Vancouver, Clark, Washington due to complications from a gall bladder operation. She was buried 04 Sep 1946/7 in Brush Prairie Cemetery. Myrtle's final residence was located in Portland, Multnomah, Oregon.

On 15 Aug 1881, George occupied homestead 20842 in Turtle Mountain County, located in Killarney, Manitoba, Canada near the North Dakota border. George's homestead was located on E ½ lot 22, twp 3, range 17. He applied for this property 08 Jul 1882 and later applied for a crown patent for the homestead through his attorney, George Joseph Maulson, 14 Dec 1885. George received Letters Patent on 15 Feb 1886 for the property, though it was referred to as the SE ¼ 22-3-17 W1 (see Figures 06 and 07). He also received the patent for the NE ¼ of the same section.

A letter from Kathleen M. Richards 30 Mar 1979 says her father often talked about early times. Her grandfather Charles Richards went out in 1880 to choose the land and came back with his wife and family in 1881. His neighbors in 1881 were: Thomas Rumball, George Haacke, Paul Cleave and Manny Callaway. They filed for their land in 1882 when the land office opened. These 5 men worked together to cut logs and build their 5 log cabins. There was no snow until March and the men were able to relax on the grass while building in February. In 1882 January or February, David Hysop arrived and chose land for himself and his son. He engaged Paul Cleave and George Haacke to build cabins on the homestead while Hysop returned to Toronto. Haacke and Cleave got the logs, but there was very heavy snow in March so they were unable to build, so Hysop bought a large tent in which his family and horses lived until the houses could be completed.

Crime of Stevensville, Montana August 13th 1903

As told by Elsie (Haacke) Moore, Moen

A particularly horrid crime occurred in Stevensville, Montana, just after the turn of the century. On August 13, 1903 the six year old son of Mr. and Mrs. John Buck (Annie Haacke) disappeared.

He was Alfonso Buck (Fonny). He disappeared on a Thursday evening, and for more than two days, practically everyone in Stevensville turned out for organized search parties: then on Sunday morning while many were in church, the town fire whistle blew, as a signal that he had been found. Church bells were rung and anvils pounded to bring the searchers back from surrounding fields.

Thomas Baird, one of a group of ten, who had been beating the grass and under brush with farm tools in the area southwest of St. Mary's Mission had found Fonny, lying face down in the mud and water of the big slough in a secluded spot where thick briars made a sort of hedge.

Lou Young, of one of the searching parties carried the body back to town, and turned him over to the doctors and the law. Doctors examined the body and found that the boy had been a victim of sexual assault. The body was mutilated and there were prints around his neck and throat, showing he had been choked. In the pocket of his overalls was still a soggy banana.

Justice of the peace, Solomon Sedgewick immediately impaneled a jury. Baird and Young testified as finding the body, and the physicians pronounced that the boy had died from shock causing convulsions as the result of an unnatural sexual act.

Miss Vivian Turner (Vivian Irvine Stuart) was 16 at the time and boarding in town with Charles H. Bucks while she attended the Stevensville training school. Vivian testified that she had seen Fonny, together with a strange young man in town, whom she identified as Johnson, going past Buck's house between 8 and 9 o'clock Thursday evening. She had also seen the man earlier in town, when she went on an errand for Mrs. Buck. S.B. McNett also testified that the boy and the man passed his house at about the same time; the McNetts lived just west of the Mission and just north of where the body was found.

Walter Johnson had been working on a ranch on Sunset Bench and when the law went looking for him, he had disappeared an all-out search was organized and the roads leading out of the valley were blocked. He was finally arrested south of Stevensville, taken into custody by Sheriff Joshua Pond. He was escorted to a cell in the county of Hamilton Montana.

Jackson had no money to hire an attorney, so the court appointed Robert O'Hara to defend him.

Feelings ran high in the valley and Jackson was kept under a round the clock guard until the time of his trial on September 13th. At the trial it had come out that Jackson had recently finished serving a 30 day sentence for attempt assault on a boy in Spokane, Washington.

He was found guilty of the murder of Fonny Buck and sentenced to hang. O'Hara appealed the sentence and a new trial date was set.

Things had quieted down by that time, the guard had been suspended and the 24 yr. old Jackson sat in his cell awaiting a second trial.

On October 13th, in the quiet of the night, men started gathering on the way to the county jail in Hamilton. Approximately 150 masked men came to the county jail, demanding the keys to the cell from Stevens the jailer. They took the prisoner out of the bed and hung him to a cross piece of an electric light pole in front of the Ravalli Hotel, Hamilton.

The mob had apparently formed in Stevensville and gathered strength as it marched to Hamilton. They were an efficient and very quiet group throughout, they raised no alarm.

According to the newspaper accounts of that time, they hanged Jackson barefooted, clad only in his underwear, with his hands tied behind his back.

Jackson struggled as the noose was being put in place, he got the rope in his teeth and it took several men to pry it loose.

He swung at 1:21 am on October 14th, was left hanging till 2:07 am. At that time the county coroner, F.M. Loskwood was told Jackson was dead and that he could have the body. It was cut down immediately and taken to Dowling's Mortuary, where morbid and curious crowds viewed it all the next day.

The jury impaneled at Hamilton on the afternoon of Oct. 14th found that the deceased had met his death at the hands of an unknown mob.

More sober citizens of the valley had hoped that Jackson would be hanged legally, rather than otherwise, but mob action prevailed.

As a young girl, I used to hear my mother talk about this murder as it was my dad's nephew. I recall she had told me that he was mutilated with a tin can lid.

As my dad was up in years, my husband had visited him in Hamilton where he lived. He was telling the story and he told me that they had always wondered who had shimmied up the pole to tie the rope. He never did say but he did have a smirk on his face.

Fifth biker dies of injuries

The man who got into an accident Thursday on a Honda trike has died of his injuries, which brings the total number of fatalities for the 2007 Sturgis motorcycle rally to five, according to the South Dakota Highway Patrol.

Paul Sales, 60 of Wendell, Idaho, died of his injuries Friday, according to a report from the Highway Patrol. The accident had already claimed the life of 58-year old Hazel Miller of Hagerman, Idaho.

The two were traveling on Interstate 90 about seven miles east of Sturgis on Thursday evening on a 2002 Honda trike driven by Sales when the trike left the interstate and went down a steep embankment.

Miller was pronounced dead at the scene. Sales was airlifted to Rapid City Regional Hospital where he later died of his injuries, according to a Highway Patrol report.

Neither rider was wearing a helmet.

As of the last Saturday of the Sturgis motorcycle rally, there had been a total of 86 injury accidents, according to the Highway Patrol.

Timothy Holsinger, 43 of Cherryvale, Kan. remains in critical condition at Rapid City Regional Hospital following a Saturday accident. Holsinger lost control of his 2007 Harley-Davidson on Saturday morning after swerving to avoid slowed traffic on Interstate 90 two miles east of Kadoka.

That there are no property rights to be adjudicated in this action.

That for more than five years immediately last past, plaintiff and defendant have been and now are living separate and apart, and that it is impossible for them to ever again live together as husband and wife. That all the legitimate aims and ends of matrimony have ceased to be served, and that plaintiff is desirous of obtaining a decree of divorce forever dissolving the bonds of matrimony now existing between himself and the defendant.

From the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Court makes the following

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

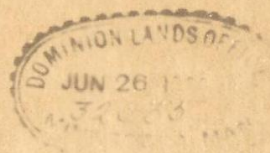

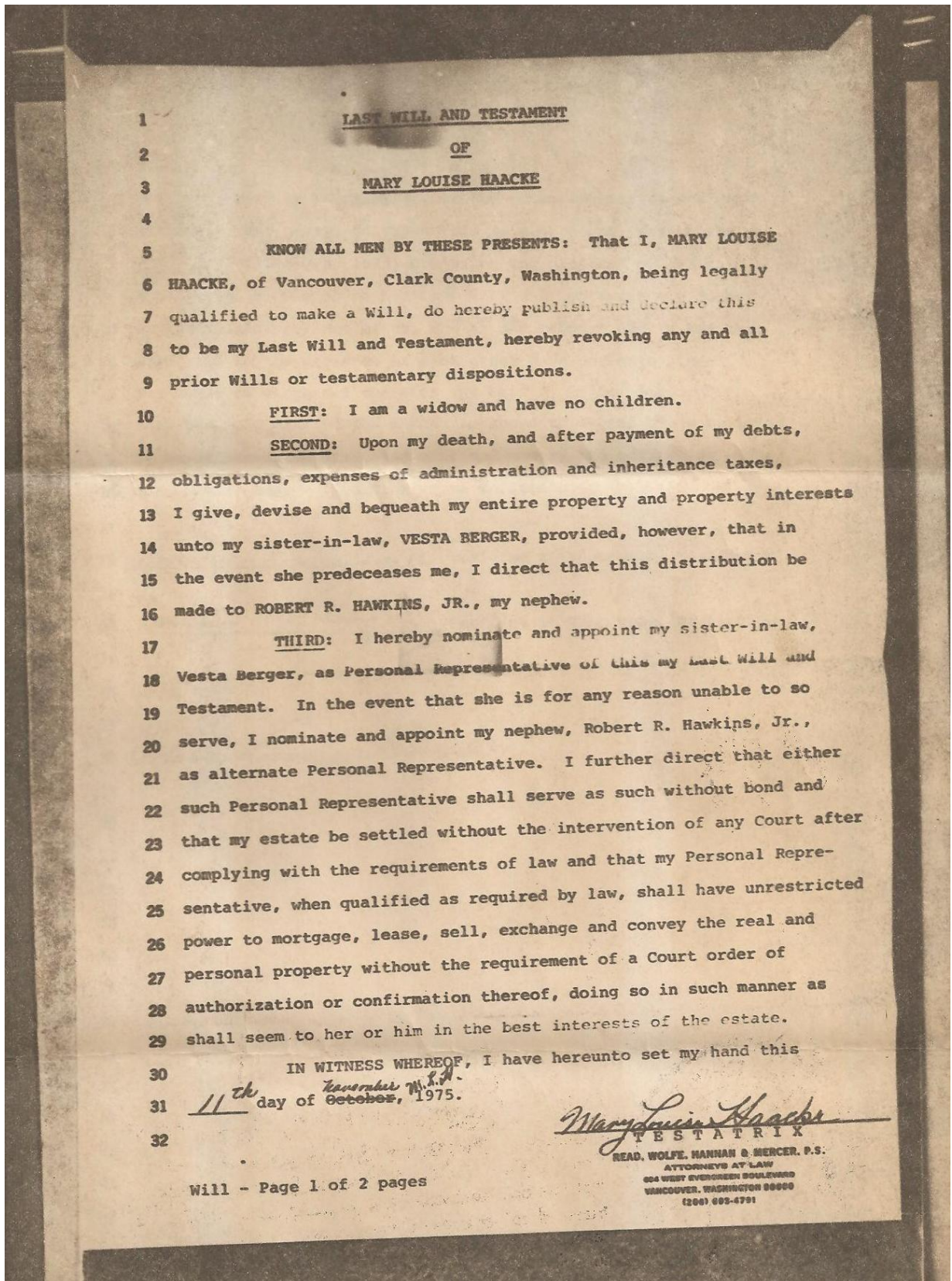
