HISTORY OF FULTON COUNTY.

Capt. David Haacke was born in Markham township, Upper Canada, July 25, 1801. He came to Fort Clark (now Peoria) as early as 1822 and to this county in 1827, and settled on a farm, where he resided for 48 years. He has lived in Canton during the past few years, having partially retired from business. The Captain participated in the Black Hawk war; was at the battle with the Indians on Rock river in which the militia were defeated. He received his commission as Captain of the 32nd Reg., Ill. Militia, from Gov. John Reynolds. It is dated at Vandalia, Ill., Aug. 20, 1833, but ranking from April 13. His parents were John and Hannah (Adams) Haacke, the former of Holland, the latter of New York city, and a cousin of John Quincy Adams. Capt. H. has been married 4 times. In 1823 he married Margaret Barker, of Tazewell Co., deceased; in 1836 married Sarah Bull, of this county. She died in 1843. He was again married, this time to Melinda Edwards, of this county. By this marriage 2 children are living, Margaret, the wife of Geo. Holmes, of Stark Co., and Amelia, wife of Lovel Hamlin, of Canton. He married his present wife, Mahala Louderback, April 1, 1851. They have 3 children: Barbara, living in Stark Co.; Sarah lives with parents; and John, of Joshua tp. Mr. H. is one of the very few early pioneers now living, and his accounts of the early times are very interesting, as also those related by his wife, whose parents came into Schuyler county in 1823.

David Haacke was best known for his military prowess. In 1833, he was commissioned by Governor John Reynolds to serve as a Captain of the 32nd Regiment Illinois Militia. Captain Haacke participated in the Black Hawk War in which the white soldiers were defeated by savage Indians on Rock River. (taken from an old obituary found in a scrap book prepared by Effie Holmes Galbraith)

In 1974? I visited Canton and met with several descendants of the infamous Captain David as they all still call him there. They are all proud of him and their family.

During that visit, I met Frank Haacke a son of Vivan. He had in his possession a flintlock from the 1834 Black Hawk War which had apparently been used by Capt. David Haacke.

There is a story, I am told, that David rescued two of one of the chief's sons during a battle by riding his horse through the battle and picking the children up onto his horse. Evidently, at a reunion about 1900 in Des Moines these two sons and Barbara (Haacke) Holmes were present. She was there to represent the Haacke family on behalf of their father. It appears as if there were some Indians fighting with the whites in this battle.

This newspaper article directly relates to this story about Captain David's heroic nature:

Canton Woman to be Present at Anniversary of Fortress

Among the interested spectators that will be at the celebration to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the establishment of Fort Armstrong on Rock Island, which will be held in the tri-cities, Davenport, Rock Island and Moline, June 18-25, will be a Canton woman, Mrs. George Palmer, 419 West Maple Street.

Mrs. Palmer is greatly interested for two reasons, first because her father was a veteran of the Black Hawk war, and knew the famous (wd) chieftain. The second reason is that the two descendants of Black Hawk, who are expected to be at the Centennial, she believes are the ones whom her father told her years ago he had rescued from death. Concerning that rescue Mrs. Palmer wrote the following letter to Director George D. Benson at Rock Island:

"Dear Sir: I am writing you in regard to the centennial to be held in Moline in June. Friends of mine who reside in Moline sent me newspaper clippings containing information regarding the celebration and I am deeply interested in the movement as my father was captain and fought in the Black Hawk war.

"I have my father's commission, which was presented to him by Governor Reynolds, and I shall have it with me if I do decide to attend the centennial."

"My father at one time saved the lives of two sons of Black Hawk, and this is the reason that I am so anxious to see them, as this story has been handed down through our family as a tradition of which to be proud. My father was a great friend of the great chief, as by saving the lives of those two boys, (which I believe are the same ones which will attend the centennial). He earned the lifelong gratitude of Black Hawk"

"An early reply to this letter will be greatly appreciated by me. MRS. GEORGE PALMER.

Place of Honor for Her

Mr. Benson immediately replied to Mrs. Palmer's letter, expressing the appreciation of the association for her interest in the event and informing her that a place of honor would be reserved for her, should she be able to attend the celebration.

David Haacke was born in Canada on July 25, 1801. His specific place of birth was Markham Township in upper Canada. He was the son of John and Hannah (Adams) Haacke. David's mother, Hannah was a cousin to John Quincy Adams, the sixth president of the United States. David Haacke left his place of birth at the age of 21 and migrated to Fort Clark (now called Peoria). Five years later, in 1827 he came to Fulton County and settled on a farm eight miles southwest of Canton, Illinois. David Haacke is described in history books as a pioneer of Canton. In one particular history book Harrison Fellows gives his perception of Captain David Haacke. He described him as a man of "formidable dress" and a man who was "quite proficient in tactics"(excerpt from Canton: It's Pioneers and History by Swan pp.95-98). Captain Haacke spent forty-eight years on his farm in the outskirts of Canton.

Today we are spoiled with the communications systems that exist. To say hello a thousand miles away is a quick phone call or a 25 cent letter which will arrive in a few days. Amazingly, David must have kept in touch with his family back home. Fifteen years after he left, he was joined by his youngest brother Edward.

It is interesting to note that today a long "a" in that part of Illinois is pronounced as a short "i"; thus Haacke is phonetically pronounced Hickey. The Toronto branch pronounces the name Haykey. Other western branches pronounce it Hackey. As invariably happens in some of these circumstances, the name undergoes a metamorphosis, in this case Edward's children changed their name to Hickey.

After reading about the supposed relationship of David with John Quincy Adams, I checked the Adams' family records and found no close connection at all. Nevertheless, after leaving the problem for ten years, I returned to it briefly when the same story arose from another branch of the family which had not been in contact with David's for 150 years. David's brother Henry moved to the western part of Ontario and his descendants ended up in Vancouver, British Columbia. From them I learned of the story that we were related to the first President of the United States. I returned to the Adams books and, since I had found no record of a Hannah marrying John Haacke, instead I looked for a David Adams in the state of New York. Perhaps the church records of that time might have the clue. Well there was a David.

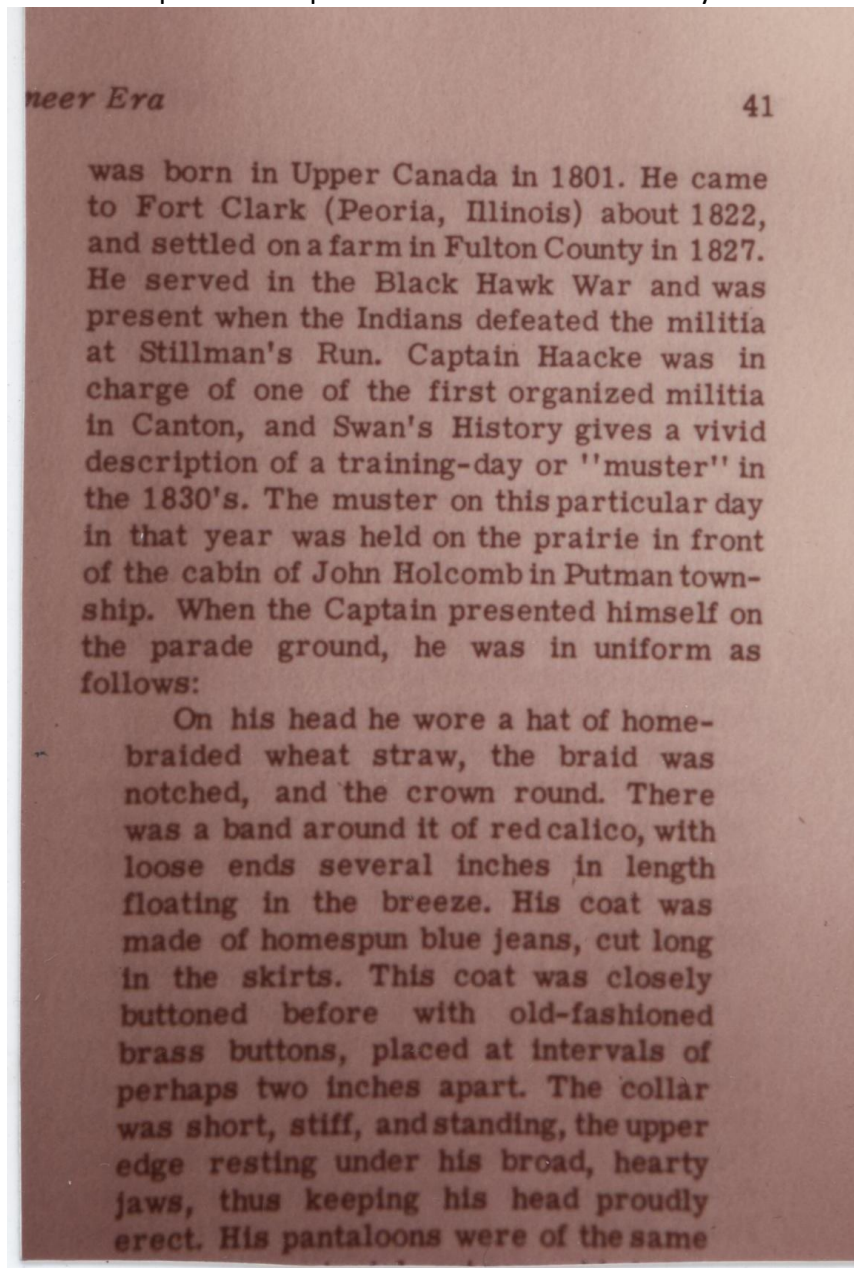
David Haacke's personal life was as interesting as his military life. He was married at least four times, and according to others(names?) he was married no fewer than five times. His matrimonial history began in 1823 when he married Margaret Barker of Tazewell County. Margaret gave birth to three children - Mary Ann, Elizabeth, and David. Mary Ann married James Bagley of Putnam Township. Elizabeth married John Hepperly of Tazewell County. Elizabeth and John had one daughter, Mrs. Leona Steidly, of Greenview, Maynard County.

In 1836 Captain Haacke "tied the knot" again. His second wife was Sara Bull, of Fulton County. Sara died seven years after she married David. His third wife was Melinda Edwards, of Fulton County. Melinda bore two daughters, Margaret and Amelia. Margaret married George E. Holmes , of Stark County and Amelia married Lovel G. Hamlin, of Canton.

Mahala Louderback became his fourth wife in 1851. This marriage resulted in three children, Barbara, wife of Robert P. Holmes, of Alta, Iowa; Sara, wife of George Palmer of Canton; and John Haacke, of Putnam Township. (This information was obtained from an old obituary found in a scrap book prepared by Effie Holmes Galbraith.)

When I discovered that Captain Haacke was married at least four times, it led me to ponder the tradition of marriage. Today it is not uncommon for a person to marry more than once. However, I wonder if Captain Haacke's number of spouses was an exceptional case in the 1800s. Even at the present, four marriages in one lifetime is not the norm. However, in researching the history of other relatives, I discovered that many people were married more than once. This is probably due to practical reasons. It was not uncommon for a woman to die in childbirth at this time. If this did occur, who would take care of the children? Finding a new partner was the solution to this problem.

Ref: This excerpt is taken verbatim from the book entitled Canton: Its Pioneers and History pp. 95-98.

Harrison P. Fellows, Esq., gives the following graphic account of the first training he witnessed in Illinois: This training, or "muster", as our first pioneers used to call it, was held on the prairie in front of the cabin of John Holcomb, now known as the Hyatt place, in Putnam Township. Holcomb had a barrel of whiskey, which may have been the reason for the selection of his house as the military headquarters on this occasion. But let Mr. Fellows tell his own story.

"It was in the summer of 1830 - we had just moved to the country, and my father, Hiram Fellows, had rented part of Captain Haacke's house. I soon found out, in some way, that Haacke was a captain of a militia company, and as I had some knowledge of militia captains in New York, where we came from, I was filled with an intense awe of the captain. One day I mustered up courage to ask him if I might see them muster up some time, and received a kind and cordial invitation to accompany him to the next training. I was in ecstasies, and looked forward with great anxiety to the expected day. It came at last, and the captain notified me to be ready by the time he was. I ran into our part of the house, and, I tell you, it was but a short job for me to wash, change my shirt, comb my hair, and make my appearance in the front yard to await the coming of the captain and his regimentals. I did not venture to go into Haacke's part of the house; but timidly peeped through a crack in the door to get a sight at the gorgeous trappings with which, I had no doubt, he would be arraying himself. It is said that great men never appear well at their toilet, and I must have verified the observation, as I remember going back to mother and telling her I guessed Captain Haacke was not much of a captain, after all; anyhow, he did not dress up like one.

"In due time the captain presented himself in readiness for the parade-ground. Let me try to describe his dress. On his head he wore a hat of home-braided wheat straw, the braid was notched, and the crown round. There was a band around it of red calico, with loose ends several inches in length floating in the breeze. His coat was made of homespun blue jeans, cut long in the skirts- so long, indeed, I fancied that he was in danger of throwing himself, by stepping on his own coat-tails. This coat was loosely buttoned before with old-fashioned brass buttons, placed at intervals of perhaps two inches apart. The collar was short, stiff, and standing, the upper edge resting under his broad, hearty jaws, thus keeping his head proudly erect. His pantaloons were of the same homespun material, cut very wide in the legs, and correspondingly short. He wore no socks, and I noticed that his pantaloons and `stogas' did not break joints by about six inches. The `stogas' aforesaid were his crowning glory. They were built of cow-hide, very wide in the heels, very broad in the toes, and of considerable length. They were tied with buckskin whangs, while the huge counters were sewed to the quarters with other whangs, perhaps from the same defunct deer. It had rained the day previous, and the shoes had become covered to a considerable depth with clay; they had then been dried in the sun, until their deep wrinkles were hard as bone. Mrs. Haacke had, that morning, undertaken the task of cleaning and greasing them. I cannot say that that her efforts had been entirely successful, as particles of yellow clay were interspersed with flakes of unmelted hog's lard, over their broad surface.

"The captain held in his hand a formidable-looking sword, encased in a leathern scabbard. I noticed hair on the hilt, and, as at that time I was not so familiar with natural history as I have since become, I could not tell whether it was human hair or hog-bristles. The discovery filled me with a due appreciation of the captain's ferocity; so much so, indeed, that I followed him with some misgivings, and at a respectful distance; when he would look back over his shoulder to see if i was keeping up, I would stop and tremble, until his face was turned in a forward direction again.

"On our arrival at Holcomb's, we found the company waiting for the captain. He strode into the house `with all the pomp and circumstance of glorious warfare,' and I could see that by his bearing he was making an impression upon his subordinates that must be conducive to good discipline. I ventured to peep into the cabin, to get a glimpse of Captain Haacke's Staff, and I noticed that he was the best dressed, and by no means the worst looking, of the party.

"The captain now ordered Orderly-Sergeant Seth Hilton to muster the company and call the roll. This order was obeyed with due formality, and so reported, when the captain made his appearance before his men. I noticed at the same time that he had buckled on his sword. The sword-belt was a strip of raw calf-skin, perhaps two inches in width, with the hair on, hair-side out. The buckle was of iron, of the width of the strap, and I had no doubt been taken off some cow-bell strap; to this belt the sword was attached by a buckskin whang. The scabbard hung loose, and, to prevent its getting tangled among his legs, he had grasped its lower third in his left hand, while the right held the hilt. The captain stood for one moment in front of his company in dignified silence: looking slowly up and down the living line, he raised his voice to a tone of a command, and shouted, 'Company, Halt!' This order was obeyed. The next order was given in a lower tone to the orderly, and was: 'Seth, I reckon the boys are a gittin' dry; you come in with me and we'll see what can be done.' The captain now disappeared into the house, followed by Hilton. They soon reappeared, Hilton bearing in his hands an old-fashioned wooden-handled 'piggin,' which contained, in addition to the fluid courage, three small gourds as drinking-cups. 'Officers, don't you drink out of the 'piggin', shouted Haacke. 'You come this way: I'll tend to you.' The officers seem to manifest no disposition toward insubordination, but followed their commander to the rear of the corn-crib, when he proceeded to unbutton his coat and draw, from an inside pocket, a gourd that would hold perhaps a quart; this gourd was bottle-shaped, with the end of the neck cut off smooth, and a corn-cob stopper. 'Here, boys, don't you see I've got a little something nice for us officers, -Oh, my stomach!' said the captain, as he handed it around, to the evident satisfaction of the heroic band who surrounded him.

"After this performance had concluded, the serious work of drill commenced, and I soon saw that Captain Haacke was quite proficient in tactics. At one time during the day, the captain's shoes began to hurt his feet, and he ordered the company to 'Hold on, boys, till I get off these c-----d shoes.'

"During the day, Captain Saunders brought his company on the ground from his house, several miles further down the Lewiston road. He said they had run out of whiskey at his house, and hearing Holcomb had a barrel, had concluded it would be best 'just to march the boys up, you see, ---Oh, my stomach!'"

According to the family stories, Capt. David was proud to have been a Captain with Abe Lincoln in the Black Hawk War. When President Lincoln called for volunteers for the Civil War, he marched down to the Post Office to sign up. The recruiting officer said he was too old but Capt. David would not accept that and Capt. David knocked him out. Later David was allowed to train the preliminary militia as described above.

Why would these people have rented from Capt. David? Perhaps for money, or did he know them? The Bumps were also from New York. Is it possible they knew them from New York? A longshot would be to search where the Fellows and Bump families came from in New York and see if the Haackes are mentioned there or not. To date, I have found no record of Haackes in the New York census.

When studying the history of a particular individual, it is also interesting to discover interesting events that provided the people with entertainment at that time. The following excerpt focuses on "Show-day". This excerpt is from *Canton: Its Pioneers and History* pp.74-75.

"SHOW-DAY"

"Show-day" was an institution twenty years ago. The dead walls and bar-room wall had been plastered, for weeks preceding, with pictures of all sorts of impossible feats. Animals unheard of in natural history were to be there in abundance. Two clowns, the wittiest that ever were known, had been engaged at an unheard-of expense, expressly for this "great combination show." What excitement these bills produced. On Saturday crowds would stand before them, commenting on the wonders that were to be exhibited.

"Show-day" was here at last. By the first gray streak of early dawn the boys were wide awake, and have gone to the Lewistown Bridge, to see the show come in. They are small boys first who wait about the bridge; but by seven or eight o'clock older boys begin to arrive, and by nine o'clock a few gray hairs are sprinkled among the waiting crowd. A few adventurous spirits, not content with waiting for the bridge, have disappeared an hour ago over the hill toward Shaepley's, and now their shouts are heard, as they discern in the distance- away out toward Captain Slosson's-the pioneer teams of the coming show. There is a rush now; across the bottom, up the hill, splash, splash, through the mud they go, until the first wagon is reached, and then -- but pshaw, it's only a baggage wagon at last! And now they pause and wait, as one after another of the long train of wagons pass, and are all anxious --- they want to see the bandwagon, the actors, the elephants, and camels. The procession stops in the Big Creek bottom, and the forty-horse team is harnessed to the band-wagon, whose body resembles, in a distant and uncertain kind of way, the mythical dragon which no body ever saw. How the boys wonder, and how wisely the gray heads talk of "them ar leaders, that of ar off wheel-hoss." The band are mounted

now, and the procession moves. How the excitement boils and bobbles, until every fellow wishes it was always show-day. The band has crossed the bridge, but the elephant refuses to trust his weight upon the frail structure. How anxious the boys grow! Will they ever get him across? What a whopper he is. But the dilemma is overcome; he has forded the narrow stream, and the great tracks in the soft mud will be visited for a month after the show is gone. As the procession reaches the hill by "Bishop" Clark's, there are accessions to the crowd; men, women and children gather and fall into line upon both sides of the road. When the square is reached, it would not be an exaggeration to say that there were more people on the square than there was population in the town. As the band moves around the square and through the principal streets, there is a shouting, yelling procession that reminds one of a pandemonium let loose.

And now Grandmother Bridgman has set up her cake-stand, and quarter-sections of gingerbread begin to appear under the arms of hungry fellows from the country, who have started this morning before breakfast, so that no part of the procession or show might be lost. AND NOW COMES CAPTAIN HAACKE WITH A BARREL OF CIDER, AND MORE GINGERBREAD, WHICH HE IS SELLING TO HUNGRY AND THIRSTY CUSTOMERS. The peripatetic candy stand has also been opened. The vendor of razor-straps and patent soap has opened his mouth, and gathers an admiring crowd. The regular circus bummers, who follow in its train, are named legion, and are low gamblers, and will have had victims when the tents are folded and the show day is over. Here comes good old Deacon Jones, to hear the music; and there is --- but why single out, when, with one excuse or another, all will be sure to see the show; at least stand outside where they can listen to the clown and the music.

He who was not a boy in a western village on show-day, at least once in his life, knows but little of life, and is to be sincerely pitied for his ignorance. Old men, young men, old women, and children, all are here, and all will see the show. They have been picking blackberries and selling, saving eggs and churning rolls of yellow butter for the occasion. I well recollect when I visited my first show. I had earned the money by cutting "jimson weeds" around the old church in the public square, and I was richer then -- prouder of my success -- than I have ever been since, or ever expect to be.

A PIONEER GONE--CAPTAIN HAACKE'S DEATH

A PIONEER GONE-- Death of Captain David Haacke, a Resident of the State since 1822; There died suddenly, last Friday morning, at the residence of his daughter, Mrs. L.G. Hamlin, on South Main Street, an Illinois pioneer who is survived by very few of his contemporary explorers and subduers of the wilderness that lay between the Wabash and Mississippi Rivers sixty or seventy years ago. He had been a resident of the state for 66 years, of which 61 had been spent in Fulton County, and 48 on one farm, a few miles from Canton.

David Haacke was born in Markham Township, Upper Canada, July 25, 1801. His parents were John and Hannah (Adams) Haacke. His father was a native of Holland. His mother came from New York City, and was a cousin to John Quincy Adams, the 6th President of the United States. Mr. Haacke came to Peoria (then called Fort Clark) in 1822. He assisted in the building of the first mill ever erected at that place. In 1827 he came to Fulton County and settled on a farm 8 miles southwest of Canton, remaining until 1875, when he moved to this city.

He was commissioned a Captain of the 32nd Regiment Illinois Militia by Governor John Reynolds, in 1833, and participated in the Black Hawk War, being in battle with the Indians on Rock River, where the white soldiery were defeated by the savages. Captain Haacke was 4 times married. His first marriage was in 1823, to Margaret Barker, of Tazewell County. She bore him 3 children,-- Mary Ann, Elizabeth and David. Mary Ann married James Bagley, of Putnam Township. (Herself and Husband are both deceased, leaving 3 children. Elizabeth married John Hepperly, of Tazewell County, and leaves a daughter- Mrs. Leona Steidley, of Greenview, Menard County.

Captain Haacke's second marriage was [on 22 Jan., 1837] to Sara (Sally) Bull, of Fulton County, (by Seth Hilton, J.P.). She died 7 years later.

His 3rd wife was Melinda Edwards, [they were married 6 Nov., 1843 by Horace Turner, J.P.] of Fulton County, who was the mother of 2 children- Margaret, now the wife of George E. Holmes, of Stark County, and Amelia, widow of the late Lovel G. Hamlin, of Canton. His 4th wife was Mahala Louderback, married in 1851 [28 March, by H.S. Bryant, J.P.]. Three children of this union survive--- Barbara, wife of Robert P. Holmes, of Alta, Iowa; Sara, wife of George Palmer, of Canton; and John Haacke, of Putnam Township.

Short funeral services, conducted by the Rev. Haney, and very numerous attended, were held at Mrs. Hamil's(?) residence Sunday morning. The Haacke Cemetary, near the old family homestead in Putnam Township, was the place of the burial.

Captain Haacke leaves an estate consisting chiefly of a farm of 520 acres of Putnam Township and several houses in Canton. The value of the whole is probably not less than \$45,000. His will was read Monday afternoon. There is a bequeathed \$500 each to the 5 orphaned grandchildren, and the remainder of the property is divided equally among the 5 surviving children.

The following is another article on the death of Capt. David Haacke:

In this city, Friday morning last November 9th, in an epileptic fit, Capt. David Haacke, aged 87 years, 3 months and 15 days. On Thursday morning the Captain had a fit and the second one came on him Friday morning while he was eating his breakfast, partially choking him. He made his home with his daughter, Mrs. Lovell G. Hamlin, on Main street, between Pine and Walnut. The funeral services were held at the house, Sunday morning, Rev. J.W. Haney officiating and the remains were buried in the cemetery south of Independence, near the Captain's old home.

Chapman's History of Fulton county says Capt. Haacke was born in Markham township, Upper Canada, July 25, 1801. He came to Fort Clark (now Peoria) in 1822, and to Fulton county in 1827 and settled on a farm southwest of this city, between Independence and Cuba, where he resided forty-eight years. In 1875 or 1876 he purchased property on Lewiston street near the west limits of the city, and after the death of his last wife he purchased the property on Main street and has lived there the greater part of the time to his death. As one of the pioneers of Illinois he participated in the Black Hawk war and was commissioned Captain by Governor Reynolds, August 20, 1833, ranking from April 13th. He was very proud of this commission, and some years since had a number of copies printed and framed and presented to his friends.

Captain Haacke was married four times. In 1823 Margaret Barker, of Tazewell county; in 1836 Sarah Bull, of this county; third Melinda Edwards, of this county; in 1851 Mahala Louderback--all are dead.

There are five children, four daughters and one son. One daughter lives in Toulon, one in Alta, Iowa, two in Canton and the son near Oiver. Grand-children and great-grand-children also survive him. A brother Edward Haacke has resided in Canton for a few years.

By frugal living Captain Haacke had amassed property estimated from \$50,000 to \$60,000. We understand the property is equally divided by will among the five children, except a few small legacies to some of his grand-children.

My guess is that this is during his marriage to Sarah or Sally Bull whom he wed in 1837. From his first marriage to Margaret Barker he had two daughters and one son. One of these may have already married by this time as he married for the first time in 1823. The other is likely the girl between 10 and 15. His wife would be the one between 20 and 30. His son David may have been the one between 10 and 15 for the boys. The youngest boy could have been from Sarah or could be David, especially if Margaret died in childbirth. In that case the older boy may have been a farm hand. The older couple, not named could be the parents of one of the wives. I doubt they are Johann and Hannah as my records show Johann was born 1775 to 1779, hence the oldest he could be would be 65 and Hannah would be 62.

This story is taken from the book entitled The Early Pioneers and Pioneer Events of the State of Illinois (Fulton and Mason Counties).(ref.)*

This is part of a story by a Mr. Niman about Dr. Newton. We pick it up part way through and extract the two paragraphs of interest.

"While the doctor was living at our house in Havana my mother started me off one day to hunt up a girl to do our housework. I crossed the river and struck off into South Fulton, and every house I came to I enquired for girls. Finally, I was directed to an old gentleman who lived down in the edge of Schuyler county, by the name of Louderback, who was said to have four girls. I found the place and told them my business, and the oldest one agreed to go with me. It was a long trip and we did not get home until late at night. The doctor had gone to bed, but he called me to his room and wanted to know what kind of a girl that was that I brought home. I told him that she was a splendid, fine-looking

girl. "Do you think," said he, "that she would make the doctor a good wife?" I replied that I thought she would make any man a good wife. So the doctor courted her, and in about three months they were married.

This excerpt is from The Early Pioneers and Pioneer Events of the State of Illinois(Fulton and Mason Counties) pp.29-30.(ref)*

"Chapman's History says that Truman Phelps kept the first tavern in Fulton county. This is a mistake. George Baker kept a tavern in the brick house occupied by William Proctor (on the sight of the Ewan hardware store), two years before Truman Phelps came to the country. While Dr. Newton was still living with my father in Lewiston word came that the wife of Capt. David Haacke was very sick and for the doctor to come and see her. He lived about six miles north of Lewiston. Big Creek had to be crossed, and at that time the waters were high. The doctor had been drinking that day, and father was afraid for him to go alone; so he sent me along to see that the doctor got through all right. The doctor found his patient a very sick woman. He did the best he could for her, but in a few days she died. Some years after that Capt. Haacke became the owner of one of the finest farms between Canton and Cuba. After the death of Dr. Newton, Capt. Haacke married the doctor's widow and soon rented out his farm and moved to Canton. The last time I was in Canton, some eighteen years ago, I visited Capt. and Mrs. Haacke at their home, and I think they were the happiest couple I have ever met. So I think Capt. Haacke could agree with me in what I told Dr. Newton the evening that I brought the young lady to the hotel, that `she would make any man a good wife.'"

The funeral cortege will leave the family residence in Canton at 11 o'clock A.M. Wednesday, December 3, 1884, and proceed to Shields' Chapel, where the services will be held.

Friends of the family generally invited to attend.

Mrs. Mahala Haacke, wife of Capt. David Haacke, died in Canton Tuesday morning, Dec. 2, 1884, of dropsy, from which she has suffered greatly for several months. The funeral services were held yesterday, at Shields' chapel, conducted by Dr. Whiting.

There was a large attendance of relatives and friends. Remains were buried in the graveyard at the Chapel.

Miss Mahala Louderback was born in Ohio, Dec. 15, 1811. Moved with her father to Indiana, and from there in 1816 to Schuyler county, in this state. Married Dr. Isaac Newton in 1832, and lived for a number of years at or near what was then called Fulton Center, in Putnam Township. The Dr. died, March 28, 1857, Mrs. Newton married Capt. David Haacke, who was then also a resident of Putnam. Eight or ten years ago they moved to Canton and have since resided here. She leaves her husband and eleven children, eight by the first marriage and three by the second marriage. One son, Newton, died in the army, and one child by the last marriage is also dead, making thirteen children the fruits of the two marriages.

The following bit of information is from the book entitled Canton: Its Pioneers and History by Swan (published in 1871) p.36

"Ramblin through Spoon River County Mrs. Harriet Turner says, `Some of our neighbors were A.C. Thompson, Wm. Nichols, Dr. Newton, Samuel Turner, Capt. Haacke, and Mr. Mallory.'"

On page 97 of this book, Mark W. Saunders said:

"I know Capt. Haacke well, and I now own seventy-nine acres of the old Haacke farm. He was married five times. Four of his wives are buried with him in the Saunders cemetery, and one is buried in the Shields Chapel cemetery."

"Mrs. Hamlin Dead" – C.T. Coleman received a dispatch Monday from San Antonio, Texas, stating that Mrs. Amelia Hamlin, the widow of Lovell Hamlin, had died there this morning. Mrs. Hamlin was the daughter of Capt. David Haacke and was well known to most of our citizens, having lived here for many years. Owing to the failing health of Mrs. Hamlin, she and her family moved to San Antonio two years ago last December, where they have since resided. Mrs. Hamlin's death was caused by lung trouble. She was about fifty years of age and leaves seven children to mourn her loss, all of whom save George, were living at San Antonio. The remains will be brought here and interred by the side of her husband who died several years ago.

More about Lovell Gorham Hamlin:

"Tending Horses" – Lovell H. kept a "Livery Stable." Owned a large black cab, to which he hitched a team of shiny, black horses. Buckles and trappings of the harness were polished until they shone.

The drivers wore a black topcoat and a tall black hat.

Meeting all trains, both day and night, he hauled the common passenger as well as the "elite." Physicians call[ing] to distant homes used the services also. Sleeping in the back seat, to and from their destination was a rest for the tired doctor. Especially in periods of epidemic were the cab drivers busy.

Country people who drove to town for the day left their teams at the livery stable. Unhitched from buggy or wagon, they were fed and watered at noon, and in winter sheltered in a warm barn.

The land once used by the "Hamlin Livery Stable" facing Avenue A from Elm to Pine Street, is now occupied by the National Bank of Canton.

The spacious family home at 397 West Maple Street is still in use. Basically, it looks much as it did over 55 years ago."

The 1880 U.S. Census Record lists them as a “Family” and Chapman’s History of Fulton County writes of them together...They were only 3 or 4 houses from the Hamlins. The Palmer house burned January 3- 1971. A new one has been built on the lot.”

Mrs. Mahala Haacke, wife of Capt. David Haacke, died in Canton Tuesday morning, Dec. 2, 1884, of dropsy, from which she has suffered greatly for several months. The funeral services were held yesterday, at Shields' chapel, conducted by Dr. Whiting.

There was a large attendance of relatives and friends. Remains were hurried in the graveyard at the Chapel.

Miss Mahala Louderbach was born in Ohio, Dec. 15, 1811. Moved with her father to Indiana, and from there in 1816 to Schuyler county, in this state. Married Dr. Isaac Newton in 1832, and lived for a number of years at or near what was then called Fulton Center, in Putman township. The Dr. died, March 23, 1857, Mrs. Newton married Capt. David Haacke, who was then also a resident of Putman. Eight or ten years ago they moved to Canton and have since resided here. She leaves her husband and eleven children, eight by the first marriage and three by the second marriage. One son, Newton, died in the army, and one child by the last marriage is also dead, making thirteen children the fruits of the two marriages.

In this city, Friday morning last, November 9th, in an epileptic fit, Capt. David Haacke, aged 87 years, 3 months and 15 days. On Thursday morning the Captain had a fit, and the second one came on him Friday morning, while he was eating his breakfast, partially choking him. He made his home with his daughter, Mrs. Lovell G. Hamlin, on Main street, between Pine and Walnut. The funeral services were held at the house, Sunday morning, Rev. J. W. Haney officiating and the remains were buried in the cemetery south of Independence, near the Captain's old home.

Chapman's History of Fulton county says Capt. Haacke was born in Markham township, Upper Canada, July 25, 1801. He came to Fort Clark (now Peoria) in 1822, and to Fulton county in 1827 and settled on a farm southwest of this city, between Independence and Cuba, where he resided forty-eight years. In 1875 or '76 he purchased property on Lewistown street, near the west limits of the city, and after the death of his last wife he purchased the property on Main street and has lived there the greater part of the time to his death. As one of the pioneers of Illinois he participated in the Black Hawk war and was commissioned Captain by Governor Reynolds, August 20, 1833, ranking from April 13th. He was very proud of this commission, and some years since had a number of copies printed and framed and presented to his friends.

Captain Haacke was married four times. In 1823 Margaret Barker, of Tazewell county; in 1836 Sarah Ball, of this county; third Melinda Edwards, of this county; in 1851 Mahala Louderbach—all are dead. There are five children, four daughters and one son. One daughter lives in Toulon, one in Alta, Iowa, two in Canton and the son near Civer. Grand-children and great-grand-children also survive him. A brother, Edward Haacke, has resided in Canton for a few years.

By frugal living Captain Haacke had amassed property estimated from \$50,000 to \$60,000. We understand the property is equally divided by will among the five children, except a few small legacies to some of his grand-children.

Writing Non-Sexy Books Can Be Successful, Too

The other day there was a letter in the mail from a would-be writer who complained a little that you have to write a sexy book to be a success these days. It's true that sexy books do sell but don't underestimate the spiritual and inspirational. Marjorie Holmes was in town last week—a radiant success, if I ever saw one. Her book, "I've Got to Talk to Somebody, God," was published last February and has just gone into its third printing.

Miss Holmes, married to a Washington businessman, Lynn Mighell, the mother of four children and grandmother of three, is small (under five feet tall), blonde and smart looking. She is also smart and perceptive enough to know about the private aches and agonies of people and religious enough to believe there is help for them.

A veteran magazine writer, author of seven novels and a twice-a-week column in the Washington Star, she took up writing so-called "inspirational" stuff (she calls it "Creative") for several reasons. The first was the desire to stay home and personally rear her children, who were spaced about five years apart. The second was the conviction that she must write "to reach people who presumably need what I had to say."

"I had a wonderful English teacher in college," Miss Holmes told me. "As an assignment she had us write something every day for six weeks. I was working at the time as a stenographer to send myself to school and I didn't have much time. But every day I wrote something—a bit of poetry, a paragraph of description, a little personal adventure. When I turned it in and she read it she wrote me a wonderful note, which I kept and still have framed over my desk."

The note told her that she wrote well and urged her to keep writing "beautiful things for people who crave beauty," adding, "There is a duty."

From her newspaper column, "Love and Laughter," she wrote her first inspira-

tional book. This new one, "I've Got to Talk to Somebody, God," (Doubleday, \$3.95) also contains some of her columns. Although she is now an Episcopalian and loves the formal prayers in her prayer book she found that the informal, intensely personal "conversations with God," which she occasionally ran in her column, were moving and helpful to great numbers of people.

As she wrote in the forewords, there's little communication today. "The very push and pressure of living among so many people has driven us deeper inside ourselves. There, despite all the talk that swirls around us, we are locked in a lonely prison. It is a secret and special place, a place for our own protection, yet a place of anxieties and fears, where the loneliness can be intolerable unless we find God there."
