

# The Descendants of Richard Burnell and Priscilla Owen

This story begins with two paintings of horses in my grandmother's photo album and a picture of my grandfather in Edith Welfare's back garden about 1918. For the longest time, I wondered why there were paintings in a photo album with no indication of whose they were or why they belonged there. But clearly there was some significance attached to these paintings to be kept with other family photos. The family heralds from the Bristol community and fanned out a little over the years to a place not too far south, about an hour's trip by country train to Bruton. Although I have discovered a reasonable way's back in the family, I personally only knew the more modern generations from the 20<sup>th</sup> century although my grandfather had contact with the family in the first world war when memories were still intact between sisters and cousins.

The real starting point to tying the family together came from my grandmother's bluebook which had the address of a Daisy Palmer. (Actually the following was written in her record book: Mrs. Daisy Palmer (Aunt Edith Lewis's cousin), Drummuir Nore Road, Portishead, Somerset, near Bristol, England, parcels sent during WWII d 12/7/50 or 52.) I took a chance that there might still be someone there 30 years later. In 1979, I received an answer from the present tenant who knew of the people of whom I was inquiring (he was the second person after Daisy Palmer died to live there) and gave me the address of an Isabel Lewis. Another key came \*from my grandmother Anna's family photo album where I recalled seeing a picture taken of my grandfather Harry Ross Haacke during the first world war in Bristol and another picture close by of a cousin, Edith. Pursuing these clues led to the following results going back many six generations.

The first generation of families connected to grandfather Harry's mother Maud Fisher were:

Richard Burnell born circa 1780-1790 who married 26 March, 1811 to Mary Jane Quarterly.

Their son Richard Burnell born 1815 married 6 June, 1843 to Priscilla Owen. He was of full age, bachelor, coachman, St. Philips, father: Richard Burnell, labourer. She was of full age, spinster, St. Philips, father: Benjamin Owen, labourer. Both signed the marriage certificate.

She was the daughter of their future in-laws, Benjamin Owen who married 13 Sept., 1813 and Mary Woodruffe (born 1817, died 1868). After Priscilla died, Richard married again to Maria Excell? These events all took place in St. Philips County, Bristol. A key record to ensuring I had the family in line correctly came from this marriage record:

Richard and Priscilla had five children, all of whom in some way have become known to me now and whom my grandfather may well have known in person thanks to his visit back to Bristol and Bruton.

These were: 111 - Edwin (born 1840) 11 Aug., 1920;

211 - Elizabeth Emma Burnell (b 25 January, 1844, Clifton) m1) 28 July, 1862, Henry Fisher (son of George Fisher (hatter) born in London, lived at 7 Church Alley, Castle Precinct, married Elizabeth) and m2) 18 June, 1888, to John Walker Russell (she or they with their children emigrated possibly to New York City first and then to Toronto in the late 1880s);

311 - Sarah (m February 17, 1867 to Edwin Lewis);

411 - Edith (born to Mary Excell?) and

511 - Priscilla (born 1870 to Mary Excell?). By the time my grandfather Harry Haacke arrived there in the first world war most of these children would have been approaching 70 years of age. Elizabeth then Elizabeth Russell was Harry's grandmother (we have a four generation photo with Elizabeth, Maud, Harry and his daughter Dorothy taken likely in Toronto or perhaps at the cottage, see Figure 1 below).

To give this family history a simple generational perspective:

generation 1) 1 - Richard and Mary Jane Burnell;  
generation 2) 11 - Richard and Priscilla Burnell;  
generation 3) 211 - Elizabeth Burnell Fisher Russell;  
generation 4) 1211 - Maud Fisher married George Haacke;  
generation 5) 21211 - Harry Ross Haacke;  
generation 6) 321211 - Ewart Mortimer Haacke;  
generation 7) 3321211 - Mark Haacke (myself);

A Mr. Gilbert J. Crocker with whom I had gotten in touch through the Bristol Family History Society of which I was a member wrote me numerous letters during late 1981 and throughout 1982. From his legwork:

- The 1841 census gave at Wilder St., St. Paul, Richard Burnell age 25, Coachman with Priscilla age 25 and Edwin age 1.
- In 1871, at 7 Victoria Street, St. Paul's Bristol, Richard age 53, Coachman (now with wife Maria age 34 born Bath, Somerset) and Priscilla 3 months born in Bristol. Also living with them a Mary Ann Excell, widow. Age 65. [I have not obtained a copy of his second marriage certificate.] He was born at Lydeard St. Lawrence, Taunton, Somerset.
- A Richard Burnell, a laborer, married Jane Quarterly (w.? Elizabeth Burnell) on 26 March, 1811 with children James (b1821, c 24/6/1821), Robert (b1822, c 16/2/1822), George (b1826, c 19 11, 1826) and Elizabeth (b1828, c 6/7/1828). (Recall that in 1862 the witnesses to Elizabeth's marriage were Richard and Mary Jane Burnell.) [I have not checked for their death records yet.]
- On the Fisher side, the 1851 census revealed: at 7 Church Alley, St. Philip and St. Jacob was George (47) a hatter born London, Elizabeth (42), William (20) also a hatter, Walter (19), Ebenezer (14), Daniel (12),

Henry (10) (my ancestor, and also a hatter I believe), Elizabeth (8), Charles (6), and John (4) all born within Bristol Castle Precincts. From a sticky note, George's wife was Elizabeth Squibb.

In 1983, I wrote to a Mr. Geoffrey Roberts, a Genealogist in England, to continue this line of attack. He found from St. Philip and Jacob, Bristol the marriage of Richard to Priscilla Owen, his father was Richard, a labourer, and her father was Benjamin, a labourer as shown two pages earlier.

- In St. Peter, on 13 Sept., 1813, Benjamin Owen and Mary Woodriffe, both made their mark. So, Phyllis' family was close. Owen was a maiden name, not for Sarah Burnell but for her mother Priscilla.

The next step (1976) was to acquire the marriage certificate of Maud Fisher and George Haacke. Luckily the Ontario Registrar's office had this record and her father was listed as Henry Fisher. In 1977, the president of a research firm in England, Kenneth Gowie, contacted me.

- In 1978, they found that Alice Maud Fisher was born 20 Feb., 1872 to Henry Fisher and Elizabeth Emma Burnell. She was registered 1 April, 1872 as Alice Maud Mary Fisher. Anne Rotter from Kintracers sent me this information 27 February, 1978. Ken Gowie had also tried to help from Kintracers.
- Searching further, in 1979, they found the marriage certificates for Henry Fisher and Elizabeth Emma Burnell. They married 28 July, 1862 while she was still a minor. Henry was a hatter as was his father George while Elizabeth's dad, Richard, was a coachman. Both families lived on Victoria Street. The witnesses were Richard Burnell and Mary Jane Burnell. PHOTO OF MARRIAGE CERTIFICATE?

Finally, the connection with the Lewis family came via the following marriage certificate:

So now the relationship between Elizabeth Emma Burnell and Sarah Ann Burnell was clear, they were sisters.

### 211 - Elizabeth Emma Burnell Fisher Russell m Henry Edwin Fisher in Bristol



**Figure 1: Elizabeth Burnell Descendants**

A four generation picture with Elizabeth Emma Burnell, seated, married first to Henry Fisher in Bristol, England and then to John Russell in Long Island, New York. Alice Mary Maud Haacke nee Fisher, on the left, was a daughter of Elizabeth by her first marriage to Henry Fisher. Harry Ross Haacke, son of Alice Mary Maud Fisher and George Haacke, the only male on the right. Harry's daughter, Dorothy Aileen Haacke, is the little girl, so this would make it about 1913 or 1914. She is sitting on her great-grandmother's lap.

Note how they are all dressed up for this picture. Satin tops for the women and a nice suit for Harry. My guess is this picture was taken in Toronto before or after a visit to the cottage.

A fellow researcher, Bonnie Coleman wrote with the following information:

*“To help answer some of your questions, I found Elizabeth Emma Russell's Death Certificate. She died on November 8, 1920 in York County, Toronto, Canada.”*

**Figure 2: Elizabeth's death certificate** Elizabeth died Nov. 8, 1920 at age 73. However, we have her born, 25 January, 1844 so she would have been, 76 years, 10 months, 14 days. The nice thing about this death record is it is modern enough to give the names of her parents as: Richard Burnell and Priscilla Owen so we know that this is the correct Elizabeth from the records in England as well.

I have also found her Marriage Certificate to John Walker Russell on June 18, 1888 in Toronto, Canada. However, according to Elizabeth E. Russell's Death Certificate, she was living at 13 Hubbard Place, Brooklyn, New York. Harry was listed as the Informant. According to both the 1910 and 1920 Federal Census, Harry Fisher was living in Brooklyn, New York at the same address.

This is a bit strange that she may have died in New York City, but according to this tombstone she was buried with her daughter Maud along with William George Haacke as shown in Figure 3 below from the tombstone in St. John's Cemetery.

Elizabeth Emma Burnell and Henry Fisher had four children. Her husband Henry must have died, possibly back in England and somehow Elizabeth ended up in Toronto.

1211 - Alice Mary Maud b 20 Feb, 1872, died 1938?

2211 - Bess (25 October, 1885 and died November, 1945, she m1) a Mr. Walker and 2) Ed Schluter. There was a child named Milton Walker who was raised as a Fisher. Given the obit below, I wonder if this might have been say William Milton Walker?) and a twin

3211 - Dorothy (Dorothy died young, buried Astoria, Long Island, NY) and

4211 - Harry Edwin Fisher Jr. (27 Aug., 1868 in Bristol - d 28 May, 1923) m Annie L. Collins (b 1864 - d 1935). They lived in Kings, New York in 1920. She was the Annie who wrote to my Grandmother Anna about Harry visiting them and finding him hiding in the garden.

Also, a George Stanley Fisher is mentioned and a baby died young.

## SMILING AT DEATH, FAMOUS FUN-MAKER PASSES TO REWARD

NEW YORK, May 29.—(By Universal.)—Harry Fisher, famous comedian, died yesterday as he had lived, 'spoofing' the audience.

Fisher, former member of the vaudeville team of Fisher and Carroll, and leading fun maker in Low Field's shows, was recovering from an attack of pneumonia.

Yesterday as his physician deplored the necessity of cutting a hole in the sleeve of Fisher's pajamas to give him a hypodermic injection, Fisher said:

"It's all right Doc. They only cost 98 cents a suit."

He died as he spoke, with a smile on his face. Death was due to heart failure.

Fisher was born in Bristol, England. He appeared on the stage for the last time three years ago in "Oh, Lady, Lady!" Since then, he has conducted a tea room in an old Dutch mansion in Brooklyn.

Reginald's family was from Bruton back into the 1700s. His full name was Reginald William Hume Couzens. He was a tax commissioner, secretary to the Engineer's Guild, and himself an electrical engineer. He was the son of Harold William Couzens (18 Dec., 1871, d 24 Aug., 1948). He was the son of Rev. James John Couzens of Bruton, b 10 Aug., 1840, 19 Jan., 1921. His father was John Couzens b 27 July, 1796, d 1 Dec., 1853. He was a farmer. And finally the first known progenitor of this family, William Cozens m Elizabeth Down 23 Nov., 1795. Brian and Charles have a full tree of this family.

On the Jones side, John Stuart Jones 19 Oct., 1874, d 25 Sept., 1960 in Bruton. He married Florence Augusta Lewis b 1899, d Bristol, 23 Sept., 1942. His father was John Hellyer Jones b 3 May, 1845, d 28 May, 1927. His father was John Jones b 9 Sept., 1802 in Wickwar, Gloucestershire, d 9 Sept., 1888 in Bruton. He was a Maltster. And his father was James Jones b 1766 in Wickwar, Gloucestershire, m Sarah Longden.

Elizabeth and Sarah were sisters.

Maud and Florence cousins

Mark and James fourth cousins – we met in 2015 in Bristol for lunch when I was attending a meeting there.

Thanks to the then current resident (Mr. Wells) of that old address for Mrs. Daisy Palmer, that led to an address for Phyllis Couzens. When I wrote, an Isabel Lewis answered my letter. She was the daughter of Leonard Lewis and Ada Pratt. Her Grandmother, Mrs. Sarah Ann Burnell Lewis, lived at 60 Waverly Rd. in Redland, Bristol. Her grandfather died before she was born. She remembered several aunts, Edith, according to Isabel, a very clever music teacher, (and the Edith whose picture my grandmother had in her album), Emeline (she did not marry but looked after elderly ladies), Mrs. Flo Jones and Mrs. E. Palmer (Daisy). She said: “I remember one of your family came to visit in the 1914 War.” Finally, in a letter from 15 June, 1980, (her third letter to me), she gave me the address of a Mrs. R. Couzens (Phyllis Jones).

Here’s part of Phyllis’ response, from 3 July, 1980, Green Close, Bruton; her wonderful letter answered my questions and told me more about my grandfather too, someone I wish I had known. She wrote:

*“Firstly, I remember your grandfather Harry Haacke coming here to Bruton during the first world war. I have 2 photographs of him in his smart [army] uniform, taken by me a little girl with an old box camera. I can remember him coming into the house in which my son and his family now live. I was sitting at a table drawing horses and he came up behind me and looked over my shoulder to see what I was doing. I must have been 14 at the time.”* She continued to say that: *“Her grandmother was Sarah Lewis, wife of Edwin Lewis. Sarah had a cousin Edith who went to (or was born in) America. [This is likely Elizabeth’s sister Edith Whittaker.] She came to England for a visit to my grandmother’s house when I was a child.”*

I wrote back to Phyllis Couzens giving her the information I had found so far and on July 23, 1980, received a reply, part of which went:

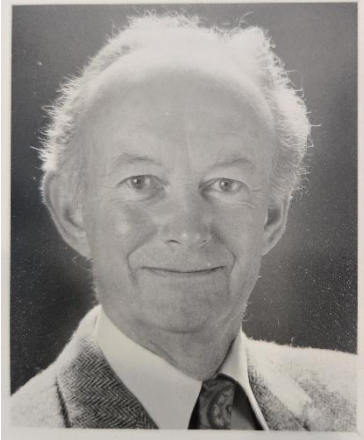
*“The name Burnell certainly does mean something to me. Inside a large old fashioned bible which came to my home after the death of my grandmother Lewis was the name Sarah Burnell! This old bible is nowhere to be found now and my family has been inclined to think I made a mistake about my grandmother Lewis’ maiden name. There was some idea it was Owen.”* She continues: *“This is all fascinating to me as I am a historian and wrote the Bruton History about 12 years ago.”*

Brian wrote me a letter 22 Dec., 1985 from St. Catherines, Bruton, Somerset, U.K. Tel. 0749812371. I had written his mother Phyllis earlier and she died suddenly 22 June, 1982 having suffered a massive heart attack. He said he had all her papers, but being an active teacher and having an acre of garden to care for, I didn’t have time earlier

to go through them. I retire August, 1988. I plan to go through my mother's "History of Bruton" and revise it where necessary and review my mom's genealogical information. My eldest son James has made a family tree for the Clarke, Jones and Couzens families. I gather the Burnell's are related through my maternal grandmother Florence Augusta Lewis. My wife Wendy and I had two sons: James Richard born 1959 married to Catherine Gillham and he is now a solicitor in Aylesbury, Buckinghamshire; and Charles Harry born 1961, currently doing research on the effect of Planning on the Countryside of Exeter University which will lead to an M. Phil. He has made his career in conservation and has worked for the Yorkshire Naturalist Trust and for the Devon Conservation Trust.

I hope you will again have cause to visit the U.K. and you will be most welcome here.

[Indeed, I was most welcome when I visited in 2014 and met Charles and took a train to Bruton and met Wendy too with Charles. They indeed have a fantastic garden!]

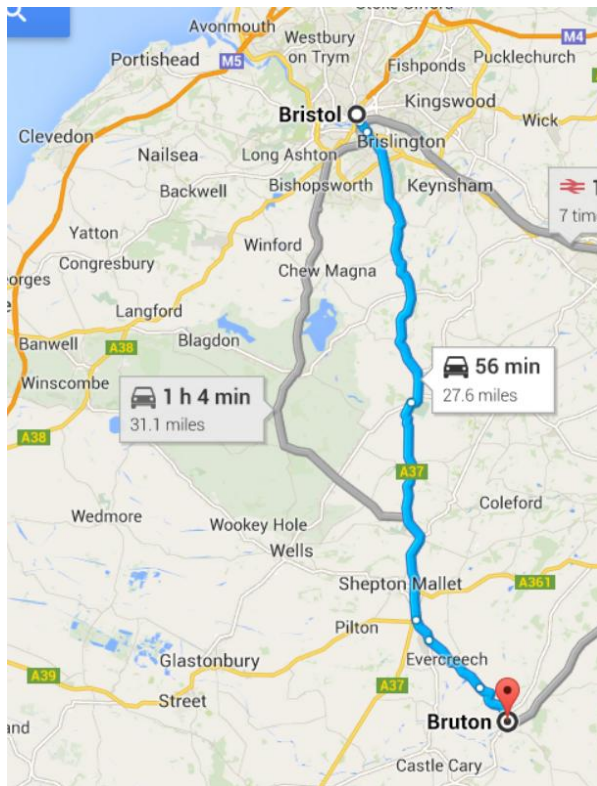
Of course, this faint memory indeed had a touch of truth in it as it was the maiden name of Sarah's mother, Priscilla Owen!

From Bristol to Bruton by train in 2014. Pontishead can also be seen here where my grandmother had an address for one of the family still living there in the 1950s. The land was sold by Edith Emily Lewis in 1954 to Capt. Turner and then in 1970 to WLJ Sell who received my letter and gave me Isabel Lewis's address!

## ***Back to North America and the 1900s***

My grandfather, Harry Ross Haacke, died before I was born. He had fought in World War I and seen his sons enlist for World War II. He lived to see them safely back home after their individual war efforts. Anna Rittenhouse Fidler, my grandmother, lived with us in the summer at our cottage on Crowe Lake near Marmora, Ontario, Canada. She was a keeper of interesting tidbits, both for physical items such as stamps, newspaper articles and other general interest items as well as family memorabilia such as photos and a record/address book. This 5"x8" one inch thick address book (hereinafter referred to as the blue book) contained wedding announcements, poems, pictures and was replete with names and dates of events for family members: initially, I did not know many of the names therein. Little did I know that three special entries in that book along with two or three photos hiding in one of a dozen photo albums, would lead me to Bristol, England.

The brunt of my early schooling in genealogical research was on my father's family who had settled in Toronto prior to 1800. As I traced his line back, I was lucky enough to find out something about the wives' families too. Unfortunately, I had little to go on about Harry's mother, Alice Mary Maud Fisher and Anna was no longer alive in 1976 to help me pursue this avenue. However, my father, Ewart Mortimer Haacke, remembered some visitors to the cottage (evidently the summer time was ideal for inviting far away relatives to come together again) an artist, George Benson, and an elderly lady Mrs. Russell. One photo also showed her at the cottage, with an inscription on the back reading: "grandma Russell". How was Fisher related to Russell? Both of these people were from New York City. Some time later, I discovered a card from my father to my mother from New York during some training during the World War II. He said he was taking some time to visit his "Aunt Bess", but the best he could do for a last name was Slater. Finally, the blue book had some help, it listed, "Bess Schluter from Phoenix died 1948". At last, something concrete to go on. She lived with her daughter Mrs. M. H. White, Edna, at 6206 S 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue. (This Aunt Bess was probably Bessie Walker Russell who married Everett A. Bowman, 2 January, 1902, in Jamaica, New York City. However, see below because she must have married a second time to Ed Schluter.)

### ***A second foray into the Schluter family: With contributions from Bill Smith in Phoenix***

In 1986, I got in touch with Bill Smith from Phoenix who was related to me through Mary Anne Haacke who married Joseph Fisher back in 1834. Bill (a 4<sup>th</sup> cousin once removed) was interested in the Fisher side but also discovered my interest in the Fisher family. He became a dedicated genealogist and for a while this for a living. Two others helped here too, Richard Burnell (actually born Schluter) and Bonnie Coleman. Again, from my grandmothers blue notebook (which I examine every year for more clues as I learn more about the family), I found the following Schluter notations:

- Aunt Bess Schluter (Mrs. Ed); (Elizabeth Walker); b 25 Oct., 1885, d 22 Nov., 1948 Phoenix, Ariz. She had had a stroke in 1947 and died of a coronary thrombosis.
- Had a d. Dorothy, son Richard, and Edna or Mrs. M. H. White, lived 6206 S 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave. and
- Mrs. Josh (Edith) Whittaker, Gran's sister was given as Aunt Bess's half sister (I assume that means Bess was born a Russell – yes her death certificate shows this.)
- Richard and Betty Schulter (m 1942) had a son Douglas Richard b 1 March, 1944 living in Jamaica, N.Y.

Bill sent me the death certificate of Mrs. Elizabeth Walker Schluter, N.Y., father John Russell of Scotland and mother nee Burnell. She died 22 Nov., 1984 of coronary thrombosis due to arteriosclerosis. In 1987, I received a detailed letter informing me that: "the house that Edwin and Bess lived in was owned by none other than George Benson!" George had married their daughter, Dorothy E. (b 20 June 1909) and in 1976 they moved to San Diego. George died as did his two sons Roger and Bruce and Dorothy remarried to Carol O'Brenivitch. *Richard (24 Jan., 1918) changed his name during the war to Richard S. Burnell.* (How interesting that his mother named him after her mother's maiden name, an indirect connection again to the Burnell relationship in Bristol, as no one else in the family knew why they had used the name Burnell.) Edwin Schluter had a brother Charles who designed, fabricated and installed smokestacks with Edwin. He moved to Phoenix in 1946 and died 1961 at age 87. He first

appeared in the Phoenix directories in 1949 and sporadically after that until 1958. Another daughter, Edna A. m Melvin H. White, had a son Stacy. Edna was a screen actress and played bit parts in two films. Interestingly, her screen name was Lyn or Lin Russell.


Edwin and Elizabeth Schluter died intestate. They were cremated in the Columbarium at Greenwood Cemetary in Phoenix. Their ashes are on deposit there. He was cremated 31 January, 1961 and she was cremated 24 November, 1948. But Bill found some vital statistics. 1) Mrs. Edna A (Schluter) White was born 23 May 1911 and married Melvin H. White. They had a son Stacey who has two children. 2) They had another daughter Dorothy E. (Schluter) Benson born 20 January 1909. She married George W. Benson a free-lance artist with the Phoenix Gazette. He purchased the property that Elizabeth and Edwin were renting on South 7<sup>th</sup> Ave. Edwin died in 1961. He was 87 years old. In 1976, the Benson's moved to San Diego where George committed suicide by hanging himself. They had two sons: Roger a mongoloid who died in 1964. Dorothy remarried to Carol O'Brenivitch. 3) A son Richard Schluter changed his name to Richard S. Burnell and he moved back to New York State. Edna was an actress and used the name Lyn or Lin Russell.

Edwin had a brother Charles and they were in the design, fabricating and installation smokestack business.

From Elizabeth Walker Schluter's obituary, she had a sister Edith Whittaker. Her services were presided over by the minister Dr. Charles S. Kendall of the Central United Methodist Church. Edith's husband may have been Joshua Whittaker. From Edwin's obituary, 4647 S 7<sup>th</sup> Ave. The funeral services were conducted at Bloom's South Phoenix Mortuary.

In the fall of 1990, I wrote to Stacy White. Not long after, I received a call from his mother. We spoke on the phone for some time and she verified much of the information I have just given on her family from New York. Richard S. Burnell lived in Calabash Acres in North Carolina in 1991. He wrote that Edith Whittaker was married 5 times. One of these was to a Mr. Allen. They had a son Albert J. Allen. "Bert" married a Cora (maiden name unknown) and they had no children. Aunt Edith lived in New York while grandma Russell lived on Long Island. He also said that: "I recall meeting Aunt Maud at my mother's home in Astoria, Long Island, N.Y." Aunt Edith lived in Brooklyn. [Grandma Russell died and is buried with Maud in Toronto.]

The puzzle was not quite complete though. Back in the late 1970's, I had spoken with my father's aunt Mrs. Gladys Percival. She had moved to Buffalo 50 years before and knew little of the family, except she recalls another sister of her mother named Annie! In 1991, I found an old post card dated 1910, mailed from Hyde Park, Chicago. On it is a picture of a very unique structure. The picture contains a windmill like structure outside the backyard (or garden) beside the main house. It is a three story structure, probably a storage and guest house combined and behind it is a carriage house (similar to our garages of today). My grandfather is in the garden in the picture (he was 16 then) standing by a garden swing set similar to one built at our cottage many years later and, according to my father, one which Harry always enjoyed relaxing in. I have written to the Hyde Park Historical Society to see if they could find the address for this house (and years later I visited Hyde Park and a local historian in an effort to locate the home – no luck). There is a short note on the post card (which has no return address) that reads:

"Dear sister,

I guess we will be in Toronto this season and so will have a chance to see you all. Love to all the folk.  
Your sister,  
Annie."

With the following little note written above Dear sister, "Can you find Harry? This is our house."

This Annie would have been the wife of Harry Edwin Fisher, Annie L. Collins.

More recent US Immigration records available through ancestry.com reveal trips that Harry and Anna took to New York as they crossed the border to visit.

***Moral of the genealogical story:*** There are many resources required to follow the often complicated path of successful genealogical research. Clearly, perseverance is an important trait. During the collection of data it is also crucial to review your old sources even as new ones arise as your understanding of relationships may have changed and what didn't make sense before might now fit into a more comprehensive picture. The blue book of my grandmother is one such case, it contained a wealth of information much of which only became clear to me years later. And the stories that we hear, although often perhaps not perfectly remembered as illustrated here, often contain a grain of truth that can, in the end, prove as powerful as a direct source or in finding that missing ancestor as in the Owen family in Bristol or George Benson the artist here in the United States. Finally, communicating with many relatives can often supply that little tidbit of data that turns out to be so important. None of these comments precludes the need for a careful review of primary sources such as vital statistics records, newspapers, bibles, land records, apprenticeship records etc. which, in the end, often provide the proof we need. Today, with the internet, and the scanning of more and more material, we are incredibly lucky to be able to search these online. Even then, everything is still far from online, such as family bibles, local historical society records, and personal notes and family records that may contain just the information we are seeking.

Thank you again for your kind hospitality. It was lovely to meet Wendy and Gail. I had a most lovely time at Tolpenny. I did find another letter from your grandmother and one from your dad with some pictures of himself and you and James too when you were young sporting a beard.

This is a wonderfully detailed outline of the family from James. I pulled off his email from these notes and am copying him on this as a means to say hello. For another family researcher it is a dream to find that someone has done "the other side" so to speak where I hope to fill in some missing details for him as well.

I am enclosing what I have so far. It is not properly referenced at this time, which is a bit odd since I am a scientist and pride myself in complete and exhaustive referencing. The only excuse I have is that this was prepared almost 35 years ago and was based to a large degree on family stories. I do however have the original materials such as wedding certificates from the old location of "Somerset House" and later I believe interestingly enough for you "St. Catherine's House" and references to census etc. Luckily many of these are now on Ancestry and far more accessible than the many hours and days I spent physically hunting for things when I first came to London in 1972 some 40 years ago as a young student.

I only wish I had discovered some of these things earlier, but then again don't we always wish that!

Now the Haacke lines are not given in detail here. For that you can see [www.haacke.com](http://www.haacke.com) where you will find things more in line with what James has done and you can find the details there about Maud Fisher and George Haacke's family.

Well I hope you are able to digest this information in its rather story like format. Actually I have to say I had fun putting all this together, but it was most rewarding to be able to walk in the foot steps of my grandfather. You see he died in 1950 and I was born in 1951 so I never knew him except through these and other stories.

## Memories of Bristol: Fact or Fantasy

by E. Mark Haacke\*

My grandfather, Harry Ross Haacke, died before I was born. His widow, <sup>my</sup> grandmother Anna Rittenhouse Fidler, summered at our cottage on Crowe Lake near Marmora, Ontario, Canada. She was a keeper of interesting tidbits, including stamps, newspaper articles, family photos and a record/address book. This inch-thick book (known as the Blue Book) contained wedding announcements, poems, pictures, and was replete with names and dates of events for family members.

Little did I know that two special entries in the Blue Book, along with two or three pictures hiding in one of <sup>my</sup> dozen photo albums, would lead me to Bristol, England.

Having traced my father's family to Toronto prior to 1800, I was able to find information on most of the wives' families as well. However, I knew little about Harry's mother, Alice Mary Maud Fisher, except that she had married George Haacke. And, unfortunately, Anna was no longer alive to help me with details.

The marriage certificate of George Haacke and Maud Fisher, obtained from the Ontario Registrar General's Office, listed her father as Henry Fisher. After a considerable search, both in Ontario and England for her birth or baptism, a record of the latter was found, with professional assistance, in the parish register of Bristol St. Paul. Alice Mary Maud was born to Henry Fisher and Emma Burnell, and baptized 20 February 1872. This date was close to the one recorded in the Blue Book. Further research uncovered the marriage of Henry Fisher and Elizabeth Emma Burnell at the same parish church on 28 July 1862. Since she was still a minor, her father, Richard Burnell, coachman, had to sign. Witnesses at the ceremony were Richard Burnell and Mary Jane Burnell.

### Thirty Year Old Address Useful

I had earlier discovered a photograph, taken by grandfather Harry in Bristol during World War I, of a cousin Edith. The only listing for the Bristol area in the Blue Book, however, was a Daisy Palmer. Even though thirty years had passed, I took a chance that someone living at the same address now might know of her. The present occupant, although new, was able to send the address of Isabell Couzens, a relative to whom I then wrote. However, an Isabell Lewis answered. Her grandmother, Mrs. S. Lewis lived in Bristol. She remembered four aunts—Edith, a music teacher; Emeline; Mrs. Flo Jones; and Mrs. E. Palmer (Daisy). Edith was the cousin in the picture taken by Grandfather Harry during World War I. Isabell also gave me the address of another

relative, Mrs. R. Couzens of Green Close, Burton, who filled in many gaps about the family and Grandfather Harry, someone I wish I had known. She wrote:

"Firstly, I remember your grandfather Harry Haacke coming here to Burton during the first World War. I have two photographs of him in his smart uniform, taken by me, a little schoolgirl with an old box camera. I can remember him coming into the house in which my son and his family now live. I was sitting at a table drawing horses and he came up behind me and looked over my shoulder to see what I was doing. I must have been fourteen at the time." She continued that "her grandmother was Sarah Lewis, wife of Edwin Lewis. Sarah had a cousin Edith, Elizabeth Burnell's daughter and Harry's Aunt Edith Whittaker, who went to (or was born) in America. She came to England for a visit to my grandmother's house when I was a child."

### Correspondent Related

Isabell Lewis turned out to be the daughter of Sarah and Edwin Lewis' only son Leonard. Mrs. Phyllis R. Couzens was the daughter of Florence Lewis who married John Jones. In addition to Leonard and Florence, Sarah and Edwin were the parents of Lilian, Emeline, Edith and Daisy (who married a Mr. Palmer). I asked Phyllis if she knew anything about the surname Burnell. And she replied:

"The name Burnell certainly does mean something to me. Inside a large old-fashioned Bible, which came to my home after the death of my Grandmother Lewis, was the name Sarah Burnell. This old Bible is nowhere to be found now and my family has been inclined to think I made a mistake about my Grandmother Lewis's maiden name. There was some idea it was Owen."

I was able to put her mind at ease with the marriage certificate, obtained from St. Catherine's House, of Edwin Francis Lewis, son of George Lewis, coachman, and Sarah Ann Burnell, minor, daughter of Richard Burnell, coachman.

Another gap had been filled on my ancestral chart. Sarah and Elizabeth Burnell were sisters. And Alice Mary Maud Fisher was a first cousin of the Bristol area family members.

### Research Progress Made

During the past decade, through census returns and marriage certificates, a great deal of information has been added about the Burnell family and Fisher families. For instance, Richard Burnell (coachman) married Priscilla Owen (spinster) 16 June 1843 in the Bristol Parish of St. Phillip and

Jacob. Sure enough, the surname Owen did enter the picture as that of Sarah's mother, not of Sarah.

The puzzle is not quite complete though. Back in the late 1970s, I had spoken with Harry's sister, my great aunt Mrs. Gladys Percival. She had moved to Buffalo fifty years before and knew little of the family, except she recalled a sister of her mother named Annie.

This year I found an old post card mailed from Hyde Park, Chicago in 1910. The picture, contains a windmill-like structure outside in the garden behind the main house. It has three stories, probably a storage and guest house combined, and behind it is a carriage house (similar to the garages of today). My grandfather Harry, then aged sixteen, is in the picture standing beside a garden swingset. On the postcard is a short note with no return address. It reads:

"Dear Sister, I guess we will be in Toronto this season and so will have a chance to see you all. Love to all the folk. Your sister, Annie."

Addressed to Mrs. Maude Haacke, 2 Berkeley Road, Toronto, Canada. The following little note was written above the salutation:

"Can you find Harry? This is our house."

Annie was a new name to me. I did not think Maud had a sister by that name. Only recently did I find a clue. A letter arrived from Edna White, the child of Elizabeth Schluter, who was the daughter of Elizabeth Bumell and aunt of Harry Ross Haacke, my grandfather. Edna mentioned her Uncle Harry and his wife Annie. Since I already knew the names of my grandfather's siblings, this was quite likely the brother of Alice Mary Maud Fisher, and Annie was her sister-in-law. ~~The Harry on the postcard was no doubt Harry Fisher,~~

*after for whom my grandfather Harry Haacke was named, must have lived in Chicago in 1910.*

## Book Review

**Genealogist's Handbook for Atlantic Canada Research.** Editor Terrence M. Punch, CG(C). Boston: New England Historic Genealogical Society, 1989. Hardcover, 142 pp. \$10.00 (U.S.) + shipping \$2.50 (U.S.).

This publication is the greatest single treasure for researching ancestors in the Canadian provinces of Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick: a region of close economic and historical ties, but with different methods of civil and land administration. Regional experts in each province have contributed the four main chapters, detailing major repositories, all the basic records series and bibliographies. Newspaper collections, societies, periodicals and reference maps are also included, and readers will appreciate the concise index of subjects and institutions.

In addition to the descriptions and locations of records and sources for the four provinces, there is an extra chapter called "Regional Bodies". This is a necessary feature, in the same format as the others, to describe the Acadian periods through the French regime in British North America to their post-1785 re-settlement in this region. Reference, of course, is made to the unique *Centre d'Etudes acadiennes* at the *Université de Moncton*, which employs a full-time genealogist. A second unique institution is the Genealogical Institute of the Maritimes, which has been certifying researchers in two categories for the past eight years.

It is a tribute to the Institute itself that the editor and authors are all Certified Genealogists (Canada) and have produced such excellence in this book.
